


## **SAMPHIRE HOE BIRD REPORT FOR 2011**

Samphire Hoe is owned by Eurotunnel and managed together with the White Cliffs Countryside Partnership.

The recording of the birds of Samphire Hoe provides information about the site's ecological development, its use as a migratory stopping point and a wintering ground. The birds of Samphire Hoe are recorded on a casual basis by general observations. The breeding birds are monitored by an annual Common Bird Census, this plots out bird territories. The recording area is the Hoe itself, the sea, the cliffs behind the Hoe and the east and west ends.

139 species were recorded during the year, 17 species bred in the area plus a further 3 species did so just beyond the recording area.

Thanks go to Derek Smith who has compiled the report and all the contributors especially all the Volunteer Rangers in particular Phil Smith and Tony Prentice, also to all the other observers including Ian Roberts, and Geoff Burton.



### **SUMMARY FOR 2011**

### **January**

Two Ravens flew west on the 1<sup>st</sup>, also on the same day 62 Red Throated Divers were recorded plus a Red Breasted Merganser. Twelve Rock Pipits seen on the west beach on the 4<sup>th</sup>. Fifty Gannets and 100 Auk spp were offshore on the 15<sup>th</sup>. A Pochard frequented the main pond during the first three weeks of the month, and a Curlew remained on the Hoe for ten days. Fifty Brents flew east on the 31<sup>st</sup>.

### **February**

Nine Rock Pipits on the western beach on the 5<sup>th</sup>. 2 Razorbills were seen offshore on the 8<sup>th</sup>. Seventy Brents flew east on the 9<sup>th</sup>. A Water Rail was present around the main pond area on the 17<sup>th</sup>, 5 Pintail flew east on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. A Chiffchaff was reported on the 27<sup>th</sup>, 7 Grey Partridge on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Two Ravens recorded on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>.

#### March

The first Wheatear of the year was recorded on the 12<sup>th</sup>, A Chiffchaff on the 17<sup>th</sup>, a Black Throated Diver was seen offshore on the same date. Twelve Avocets flew east past the Hoe on the 21<sup>st</sup>. 635 Brents moved east on the 26<sup>th</sup>. On the 27<sup>th</sup> 2 Slavonian Grebes were seen offshore and 2 Gadwell, 50 Common Scoter and 76 Sandwich Terns were seen to be moving up channel. Two Black Redstarts were noted on the 27<sup>th</sup>, Sixty-five Siskins moving east on the 28<sup>th</sup>, and a Shag offshore on the same date.

### April

Two Firecrests were seen on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, a Sparrowhawk on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>. The first Swallow of the year for the Hoe was also on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. On the 7<sup>th</sup> 2 Common Redstarts, 6 Willow Warblers and 15 Wheatears were noted. A female Ring Ouzel was present on the 4<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>. The first Hobby of the year turned up on the 11<sup>th</sup>, 2 Common Whitethroats on the 12<sup>th</sup> and 2 Lesser Whitethroats on the 26<sup>th</sup>. A Greenshank flew past on the 27<sup>th</sup>. On the 28<sup>th</sup> there was an easterly movement of 265 Bar Tailed Godwits, 2 Pomarine Skuas, 13 Whimbrel, 35 Grey Plovers and a Black Throated Diver. A Great Skua flew east on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

#### May

Five Pomarine Skuas flew east past the Hoe on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 15 Common Scoter flew west on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and a Marsh Harrier was seen to come in off the sea on the same day. Three Arctic Skuas were seen flying up channel on the 3<sup>rd</sup> plus 30 Bar Tailed Godwits. A single Yellow Wagtail in off the sea on the 4<sup>th</sup>. A Red Rumped Swallow was recorded over the Hoe on the 8<sup>th</sup> and five Little Egrets flew west. A Hobby was seen on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 1 flew east on the 31<sup>st</sup>. Twelve Whimbrel up Channel on the 15<sup>th</sup>. First Swift of the year was recorded on the 24<sup>th</sup>, 50 House Martins on the 27<sup>th</sup>. A Grey Wagtail flew west on the 30<sup>th</sup>. A pair of Black Redstarts and two young were also seen on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

#### June

Two Wheatears present on the Hoe on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 60 House Martins and 200+ Swifts over the Hoe on the 6<sup>th</sup>. Ten Common Whitethroats recorded on the 14<sup>th</sup> plus 7 Meadow Pipits. A female Reed Bunting was seen on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 4 Stonechats on the 17<sup>th</sup>, Four Black Redstarts on the 17<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>. A Hobby was seen on the Hoe on the 20<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, 80 Starlings on the 21<sup>st</sup>.

### July

A Collared Dove was recorded over the Hoe on the 4<sup>th</sup> and a juvenile Guillemot was seen offshore on the same day. Highlight of the month were 2 Great White Egrets flying east past the Hoe on the 5<sup>th</sup>. Seven Swifts flew west on the 7<sup>th</sup> and a Pied Flycatcher was reported to be on the Hoe on the 10<sup>th</sup>. Two Little Egrets flew east on the 13<sup>th</sup>. A Sedge Warbler was recorded on the 25<sup>th</sup>, and 43 Mediterranean Gulls were seen on the west beach also on the 25<sup>th</sup>. First of the returning Wheatears was recorded on the 26<sup>th</sup>. Thirty Common Scoters flew east on the 26<sup>th</sup>. Three Common Sandpipers were seen on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

### August

Garden Warbler recorded on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, Four Sand Martins flew over on the 8<sup>th</sup> and a Yellow Wagtail was seen along the back track on the 10<sup>th</sup>. Two Ravens flew west on the 12<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> and a Hobby was noted on the 6<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>. A juvenile Montagues Harrier flew west on the 16<sup>th</sup>. Two Whinchats on the 17<sup>th</sup> were the first birds of the autumn. A Corn Bunting was reported on the 21<sup>st</sup>. On the 24<sup>th</sup> 15 Willow Warblers, 1 Spotted Flycatcher, 1 Reed Warbler and a Common Redstart were all seen on the Hoe. A Turtle Dove was recorded on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 2 Common Buzzards flew west on the 31<sup>st</sup>.

#### September

A Common Buzzard was noted on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>, 18 Wheatears were present on the 10<sup>th</sup>. Two Yellow Wagtails flew west on the 14<sup>th</sup>. A Grasshopper Warbler was seen on the 15<sup>th</sup>. Seven Stonechats recorded on the 21<sup>st</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>. A fall of 33 Chiffchaffs occurred on the 23<sup>rd</sup> also on the same day 24 Blackcaps were recorded. One Shag, 4 Great Skuas and a Common Redstart on the 25<sup>th</sup>. A Marsh Harrier and a Great Spotted Woodpecker on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

### October

A Lapland Bunting flew over on the 6<sup>th</sup>, three Hobbys recorded this month, 1 on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> and a juvenile on the 8<sup>th</sup>. Single Short Eared Owls on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>. 70 Gannets flew east on the 9<sup>th</sup> plus an Arctic Skua, 1 Sooty Shearwater and 916 Brents went west. A Ring Ouzel was present on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>, eight Black Redstarts and a Firecrest on the 25<sup>th</sup>. A Little Gull flew west on the 26<sup>th</sup>. On the 28<sup>th</sup> 562 Siskins flew east and 822 Goldfinches flew west. One Water Rail on the 31<sup>st</sup>.

### November

On the 5<sup>th</sup> 116 Siskins flew east and 170 Starlings were seen to come in off the sea. Six House Martins flew west on the 6<sup>th</sup>. 15 Red Breasted Mergansers flew west on the 6<sup>th</sup>. One Snow Bunting on the seawall on the 8<sup>th</sup>. Two Wheatears on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 1 Yellowhammer on the 15<sup>th</sup>. Little Auk found dead on beach on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

### **December**

Two Ravens flew west on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. A Great Northern Diver offshore on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>. Four Shags offshore on the 21<sup>st</sup>. 43 Red Throated Divers flew west on the 21<sup>st</sup>, 22 Razorbills seen offshore on the 27<sup>th</sup>. A Yellow Legged Gull was seen on the rocks at the western end of the Hoe on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

### GREYLAG GOOSE Anser anser

Passage bird

5 flew east on the 15<sup>th</sup> of November.

### BRENT GOOSE Branta bernicla

Passage bird

50 flying east on the 31<sup>st</sup> of January then 70 on the 9<sup>th</sup> of February and 30 on the 19<sup>th</sup>. Spring passage got under way in March with 200 moving east on the 13<sup>th</sup>, 50 on the 19<sup>th</sup>, 765 on the 26th and 21 on the 27<sup>th</sup>. The last spring record was of 2 flying east on the 12<sup>th</sup> of April.

First bird of the autumn was 1 on the 16<sup>th</sup> of September followed by 3 on the 26<sup>th</sup>. 15 flew east past the Hoe on the 8<sup>th</sup> of October and 916 flew west on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 12 on the 12<sup>th</sup>. No other records until 3 were seen flying west on the 5<sup>th</sup> of November 39 flew east on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 22 on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 10 on the 13<sup>th</sup>. Two up channel on the 27<sup>th</sup> of December

### SHELDUCK Tadorna tadorna

Passage bird

Five flew west past the Hoe on the 4<sup>th</sup> of January, 12 on the 19<sup>th</sup> of February. Three flew east on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May and 1 on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. Two flying east on the 16<sup>th</sup> of June. Three autumn records and they were of 5 going east on the 7<sup>th</sup> of November and 1 on the 12<sup>th</sup>. 4 going east on the 8<sup>th</sup> of December.

### **WIGEON** Anas Penelope

Passage bird

1 on the main pond on the 15<sup>th</sup>, 24<sup>th</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> of January. 3 flew past the Hoe on the 19<sup>th</sup> of February. 98 flew west past the Hoe on October the 9<sup>th</sup>. One female took up residence on the main pond from the 16<sup>th</sup> of October until the 5<sup>th</sup> of November. Four flew east on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> of November.

### GADWALL Anas strepera

Passage bird

2 flying east on the 27<sup>th</sup> of March and 6 moving east on the 6<sup>th</sup> of November these were the only two records for the year.

#### COMMON TEAL Anas crecca

Passage bird

Two on the 8<sup>th</sup> of January, 10 flying east past the Hoe on the27th of March. 41 moving west on the 9<sup>th</sup> of October, 2 going east on the 6<sup>th</sup> of November.

### MALLARD Anas platyrhynchos

Resident/winter visitor

#### PINTAIL Anas acuta

Passage bird

5 flying east on the 23<sup>rd</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of February are the only two records for the year.

### SHOVELER Anas clypeata

Passage bird

Eight flying east past the Hoe on March the 15<sup>th</sup>, 8 going east and 6 moving west on the 27<sup>th</sup>. Two seen going east on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of May and 7 on the 5<sup>th</sup>.

### POCHARD Aythya farina

Passage bird

One immature bird took up residence on the main pond during the first three weeks of January

### COMMON EIDER Somateria mollissima

Passage bird

5 flying east on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of March. 9 flying east on the 7<sup>th</sup> of November.

### COMMON SCOTER Melanitta nigra

Passage bird

No large movements recorded from the Hoe this spring, 14 going up channel on the 5<sup>th</sup> of March, 3 going west on the 26<sup>th</sup>, 50 recorded going east on the 27<sup>th</sup>. On the 1<sup>st</sup> of May 38 were seen to be moving up channel and on the 2<sup>nd</sup> 15 flew down channel. 30 flew up channel on the 26<sup>th</sup> of July and 2 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Westerly movements occurred from August onwards with 6 on the 13<sup>th</sup> of August, 40 on the 8<sup>th</sup> of October, 64 on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 42 on the 14<sup>th</sup>

### **RED BREASTED MERGANSER** Mergus serrator

Passage bird

1 seen off the Hoe on January the 1<sup>st</sup>. Three flew down channel on the 27<sup>th</sup> of March. On the 6<sup>th</sup> of November 15 flew east past the Hoe.

### MARSH HARRIER Circus aeruginosus

Passage bird

Two records this year, one was one seen to come in off the sea on May the 2<sup>nd</sup>, the other sighting was of 1 flying west over the Hoe on September the 27<sup>th</sup>.

### MONTAGUS HARRIER Circus pygargus

Rare Passage bird

A juvenile bird was seen to fly over the Hoe on August the 16<sup>th</sup>. (Phil Smith)

### **SPARROWHAWK** Accipiter nisus

Resident

Not recorded during the first two months of the year. Singles on the 12<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> of March. 1 on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> of April and a single bird on July the 27<sup>th</sup>. Single sightings on eight days in August. Two on the 27<sup>th</sup> of September and 3 on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

One on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> of October, 2 on the 7<sup>th</sup>. Singles on five dates in November and on three dates in December.

### COMMON BUZZARD Buteo buteo

Passage bird

Two flew west over the Hoe on the 31<sup>st</sup> of August. One on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> of September.

### **KESTREL** Falco tinnunculus

Resident

One on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> of January and 1 on the 1<sup>st</sup> of February.

1-2 throughout March, April, May and June. Four birds recorded on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of July.

Two to Four present throughout August and up to 3 throughout September and October. Highest numbers recorded in November were 5 on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4 on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

There were single sightings on six dates in December.

A pair successfully reared two young in a hole in the cliff face near to the overflow car park.

### **HOBBY** Falco subbuteo

Summer visitor

First bird of the year was seen over the Hoe on the 11 of April, followed by 1 on May the 7<sup>th</sup> and 1 observed flying in an easterly direction past the Hoe on the 31<sup>st</sup>. Two sightings in June and they were of singles on the Hoe on the 20<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>. One on August the 6<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>, both sightings was in the area around the area of the main pond. The next records were in October with 1 being reported on October the 5<sup>th</sup>, One was seen on the 7<sup>th</sup> and the last record was of a juvenile on the 8<sup>th</sup>.

### **PEREGRINE FALCON** Falco peregrinus

Resident

Up to two seen throughout the year, possibly two pairs in the surrounding area. One of the possible two pair at least reared one young which was seen in the area on the 26<sup>th</sup> of June, and probably the same bird on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> of July.

### RED LEGGED PARTRIDGE Alectoris rufa

Occasional visitor, has bred

One on the Hoe on February the 28<sup>th</sup> then again on March the 5<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>.

Two noted on five dates in April. Any attempt at breeding could not be proved but the probable outcome was they probably packed their bags and went elsewhere because of increasing numbers of visitors to the site.

### **GREY PARTRIDGE** Perdix perdix

Occasional visitor, has bred

Two records this year, a covey of 7 on the 25<sup>th</sup> of February and then 2 on the 19<sup>th</sup> of April.

### PHEASANT Phasianus colchicus

Resident

1-2 recorded during the first half of the year, 3 females and 1 male on the 19<sup>th</sup> of March. No sightings during June and September. 1 Female on the 26<sup>th</sup> of October, 2 on the 1<sup>st</sup> of November and 3 on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. Seen on site during September with 3 on the 12<sup>th</sup> and 2 on the 26<sup>th</sup>.

#### **RED THROATED DIVER Garvia stellata**

Winter visitor

Good numbers recorded during January with 62 flying west on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 20 on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>, 8 offshore on the 11<sup>th</sup>. 50 flying west on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 30 seen offshore on the 31<sup>st</sup>. Low numbers recorded in February with just single sightings on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>. Easterly movements noted in March with 6 on the 12<sup>th</sup>, 5 on the 13<sup>th</sup>, 21 offshore on the 15<sup>th</sup>, other easterly passage birds were 6 on the 25<sup>th</sup>, 13 on the 26<sup>th</sup>, and 23 on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 15 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Three flying east on May the 1<sup>st</sup>.

First birds of the autumn were 3 flying west on the 9<sup>th</sup> of October. 5 flew east on November the 7<sup>th</sup>, Three going west on the 16<sup>th</sup> and two on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. 48 flying west on the 23<sup>rd</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of December.

#### **BLACK THROATED DIVER Garvia artica**

Occasionally seen offshore during the winter months.

One seen offshore on March the 17<sup>th</sup>, One flying east on April the 28<sup>th</sup>. Two recorded flying east on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May.

First bird of the autumn was seen flying east past the Hoe on October the 9<sup>th</sup>.

#### **GREAT NORTHERN DIVER** Garvia immer

Rare winter visitor

One reported flying east past the Hoe on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May. One offshore 7<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> of December.

### LITTLE GREBE Tachybaptus ruficollis

Occasional visitor to the Hoe

One remained on the main pond from the 29<sup>th</sup> of October to the 5<sup>th</sup> of November.

### **GREAT CRESTED GREBE** Podiceps cristatus

Common offshore during the winter months.

3 recorded offshore on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> of January. 5 on the 14<sup>th</sup> of February, 10 on the 26<sup>th</sup>. Thirty were seen offshore on the 1<sup>st</sup> of March 10 on the 13<sup>th</sup>, and 21 on the 15<sup>th</sup>. One seen offshore on June the 6<sup>th</sup>. One offshore on the 8<sup>th</sup> of September and then 1 flying west past the Hoe on November the 16<sup>th</sup>. One on the 18<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> of December, 2 on the 27<sup>th</sup>.

### **SLAVONIAN GREBE** Podiceps auritus

Rare winter

2 seen off the western end of the Hoe on March the 27<sup>th</sup>.

### **FULMAR** Fulmarus glacialis

Small numbers present throughout most of the year, a few pairs nest to the east of the Hoe.

Four to five recorded on seven dates in January. 16 recorded on the 20<sup>th</sup> of February, 9 on the 24<sup>th</sup> and 11 on the 26<sup>th</sup>. 12 on the 12<sup>th</sup> of March. Average sightings throughout April and May were between three and four although 8 were noted on May the 24<sup>th</sup>. Four on June the 1<sup>st</sup> and 6 on the 7<sup>th</sup>, 1-2 throughout the rest of the month and also through July. Single on three dates in August and 3 flying west on the 31<sup>st</sup>. Single sighting on the 10<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> of September. One on the 18<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup> and 21st of December 3 on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>.

### **SOOTY SHEARWATER** Puffinus griseus

Rare

One flew east on the 9<sup>th</sup> of October.

### **GANNET** Morus bassanus


Regular offshore during the winter months.

50 seen offshore on the 15<sup>th</sup> of January. Small numbers recorded in February with 3 on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 2 on the 14<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>. Six flying east the 26<sup>th</sup> of March and 30 on the 27<sup>th</sup>. Single sighting on five dates in April 6 flying east on the 28<sup>th</sup>. 84 flew up channel on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May, 35 going west on the 30<sup>th</sup>. 19 flew west past the Hoe on July the 18<sup>th</sup>. Forty were recorded off the Hoe on the 8<sup>th</sup> of August, 20 on the 9<sup>th</sup>, 24 on the 16<sup>th</sup>, Seventy were observed flying up channel on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 15 on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

Four flew westward on September the 26<sup>th</sup>. Three double figure counts in October and they were 30 on the 8<sup>th</sup>, 70 on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 20 on the 13<sup>th</sup>. Twenty offshore on the 6<sup>th</sup> of November 34 on the 7<sup>th</sup>. Ten were recorded on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of December.

### CORMORANT Phalacrocorax carbo

Resident



Birds present offshore from the Hoe all year.

### SHAG Phalacrocorax aristotelis

Mainly a winter visitor

1 offshore on the 28<sup>th</sup> of March. Single sighting on the 14<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> of August and a juvenile on the 24<sup>th</sup>. 1 off the seawall on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of September and on the 25<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> of October. Two seen on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of November and a single on the 27<sup>th</sup>. Four seen off the Hoe on December the 21<sup>st</sup> plus singles on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>.

### **LITTLE EGRET** *Egretta garzetta*

Scarce visitor to the Hoe, more often seen flying past.

Five flying past the Hoe on the 8<sup>th</sup> of May. 2 going east on July the 13<sup>th</sup>. Two on the rocks to the west of the Hoe on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> of August. One on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 2 on the 13<sup>th</sup> of October. Single on ten dates in November, 3 on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 2 on the 16<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>. One on four dates in December, Four flying past on the 4<sup>th</sup>.

### **GREAT WHITE EGRET** Egretta alba

Rare

Two seen flying east past the Hoe on 5 July. This was a new species for the Hoe.

#### GREY HERON Ardea cinerea

Occasionally seen on the rocks to the west of the Hoe, Most records are of birds flying over.

Recorded in most months of the year sightings being mostly of single birds flying either east or west past Samphire Hoe. Highest days count of the year was of six flying past on the 1<sup>st</sup> of August.

### WATER RAIL Rallus aquaticus


Scarce winter visitor

One recorded from the main pond area on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> of January, 1 on the 17<sup>th</sup> of February. Single sighting on the 17<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> of March. No records during the summer months. First record of the winter was of 1 by the main pond on the 31<sup>st</sup> of October. One on four dates in November.

### MOORHEN Gallinula chloropus

Common resident

At least two pairs bred on the Hoe this year and probably raising two broods each. Chicks were seen early May, late May and in July.



### **OYSTERCATCHER** Haematopus ostralegus

Regular passage bird.

2 flying east on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of May, One going west on the 30<sup>th</sup>. Two on 11 and 12 July. Two on 17 August, 4 on the 23<sup>rd</sup> and 3 on the 31<sup>st</sup> all flying east. Two flying west on 5 November. One past the Hoe on 21 and 27 December.

### **AVOCET** Recurvirostra avosetta

Rare Passage bird

12 were recorded flying east on March the 21<sup>st</sup>, Two also going east on the 30<sup>th</sup> of April. The only other record was of 2 flying east on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May.

### **GOLDEN PLOVER** Pluvialis apricaria

Passage migrant

Nine flew east on the 30<sup>th</sup> of April and 17 on May the 1<sup>st</sup>.

### GREY PLOVER Pluvialis squatarola

Passage migrant

35 recorded flying east on the 28<sup>th</sup> of April and 9 on the 30<sup>th</sup>. 17 also going east on May the 1<sup>st</sup>.

### **LAPWING** Vanellus vanellus

Passage migrant, winter visitor

1 flew east on March the 26<sup>th</sup>. 1 seen on the Hoe on July the 12<sup>th</sup>. 26 flew east past the Hoe on November the 6<sup>th</sup>, 6 on the 7<sup>th</sup>. Four were noted on the 15<sup>th</sup> of November.

#### KNOT Calidris canutus

Passage migrant

2 flew east on the 28<sup>th</sup> of April and 8 on May the 1<sup>st</sup>.

#### SANDERLING Calidris alba

Passage migrant

4 going east on April the 30<sup>th</sup>, 4 east on May the 1<sup>st</sup>.

### **DUNLIN** Calidris alpina

Passage migrant

One by the west pond on January the 9<sup>th</sup>. 12 flew east on the 27<sup>th</sup> of March. Twelve were recorded flying east on the 6<sup>th</sup> of November and 3 on the 7<sup>th</sup> and the only other record was again in November with one moving east on the 15<sup>th</sup>.

### COMMON SNIPE Gallinago gallinago

Scarce winter visitor

One seen on the Hoe on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> of January.

### BAR TAILED GODWIT Limosa lapponica

Passage migrant

Easterly spring passage was noted on the 28<sup>th</sup> of April when 265 flew past the Hoe, 21 on the 30<sup>th</sup>. A further 157 flew east on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May and 30 on the 3<sup>rd</sup>.

### WHIMBREL Numenius phaeopus

Passage migrant

Easterly spring passage birds were noted between March and May with 1 on the  $25^{th}$  of March, 13 on the  $28^{th}$  of April, 12 on the  $30^{th}$ . 12 up channel on the  $1^{st}$  of May, 7 on the  $2^{nd}$  and 1 on the  $5^{th}$  and  $8^{th}$ .

### **CURLEW** Numenius arquata

Passage migrant and occasional visitor.

A single bird remained on the Hoe during the first two weeks of January. One flew west on the 24<sup>th</sup> of February. One recorded on the Hoe on eight dates between the 8<sup>th</sup> of March until the 28<sup>th</sup>. One flew east on the 6<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> of November.

One recorded on five dates during July, 3 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Single on five dates in August and 2 on the 22<sup>nd</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup>, 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup>. Last bird of the autumn was of 1 on the 20<sup>th</sup> of September.

### **POMARINE SKUA** Stercorarius pomarinus

Scarce passage migrant

Two flew east on April the 28<sup>th</sup> and 5 on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May.

### ARTIC SKUA Stercorarius parasiticus

Passage migrant

Spring passage was noted on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May when 4 flew east then 5 on the 3<sup>rd</sup>. Returning autumn birds were recorded on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of September when 4 flew west, eleven were seen to fly east and 5 west on the 9<sup>th</sup> of October. One on the 11<sup>th</sup>.

#### GREAT SKUA Stercorarius skua

Passage migrant

One flew east on the 30<sup>th</sup> of April and on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May. Eleven flew east and 3 west on the 9<sup>th</sup> of October, 2 west on the 10<sup>th</sup> and 1 on the 11<sup>th</sup>. Last record of the year was of 1 flying east on the 7<sup>th</sup> of November.

### MEDITERRANEAN GULL Larus melanocephalus



Two offshore on the 8<sup>th</sup> of February. One on the 1<sup>st</sup> of March and 11 past the Hoe on the 27<sup>th</sup>. Two flying east on the 28<sup>th</sup> of April and on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May. 10 going east on the 9<sup>th</sup> of October and the 7<sup>th</sup> of November. Four just offshore on the 21<sup>st</sup> of December, 10 on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 22 on the 27<sup>th</sup>.





Rare visitor to the Hoe.

One flew west along the Hoe on the 28<sup>th</sup> of September.

### SKYLARK Alauda arvensis

Resident breeder, passage migrant

22 flew over the Hoe on January the 15<sup>th</sup>. Three seen on the Hoe on the 8<sup>th</sup> of February, 2 on the 24<sup>th</sup>. Three on the 8<sup>th</sup>, 22<sup>nd</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> of March plus two on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. Single on seven dates and two on three dates in April. One on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> of May, 3 on the 20<sup>th</sup> of June. Two throughout July. 27 seen to come in off the sea on the 9<sup>th</sup> of October and 29 on the 12<sup>th</sup>. Three flew west on November the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 6 on the 16<sup>th</sup>, 1 on the 19<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>.

First birds of the year were five on the 12<sup>th</sup> of April followed by 4 on the 25<sup>th</sup>. Twenty over the Hoe on the 8<sup>th</sup> of May, 40 on the 21<sup>st</sup> and 50 on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup>. 60 recorded on June the 6<sup>th</sup>, 30 on the 14<sup>th</sup> and 35 on the 28<sup>th</sup>, many of these sightings are birds from the cliff nesting colony at the east end of the Hoe. High numbers noted in July with 65 on the 25<sup>th</sup>, 85 on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 100 on the 27<sup>th</sup>. Numbers increased in August with 120 on the 6<sup>th</sup>, 108 on the 7<sup>th</sup>, 100 on the 23<sup>rd</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>, 180 on the 31<sup>st</sup>. 40 flew west on the 9<sup>th</sup> of September, 65 on the 14<sup>th</sup> and 33 on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. 18 going west on the 8<sup>th</sup> of October, 40 on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 8 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Last birds of the year were 6 on the 6<sup>th</sup> of November. 25 active nests at the East end. 16 at the west end.

### **MEADOW PIPIT** Anthus pratensis


Resident, passage migrant

### PIED WAGTAIL Motacilla yarrellil



Numbers increased in August with 8 on the 9<sup>th</sup>, 9 on the 22<sup>nd</sup>, 6 on the 30<sup>th</sup> and 5 on the 31<sup>st</sup>. There were four double figure counts in September and they were 11 on the 5<sup>th</sup>, 20 on the 7<sup>th</sup>, 18 on the 10<sup>th</sup> and 10 on the 16<sup>th</sup>. In October 8 were noted on the 4<sup>th</sup>, 4 on the 12<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> and 3 on the 31<sup>st</sup>. Four single sightings during the first week of November one of which was reported to be of the Greenland race. Last sighting of the year were 2 on the 13 November.


### RING OUZEL Turdus torquatus

Scarce passage migrant

Two spring records this year with a female seen on 4 April, 1 on the 7<sup>th</sup>. There were also two records in the autumn, 1 on 7 October and 1 on the 16<sup>th</sup>.

#### **BLACKBIRD** Turdus merula

Resident, passage migrant, winter visitor.



Numbers remained fairly consistent during the first eight months of the year but increased during the last three months with continental birds adding to the numbers.

Breeding 7 pairs.

### FIELDFARE Turdus pilaris

Uncommon winter visitor

One on the 14<sup>th</sup> of October was the first bird of the autumn, Single on the 29<sup>th</sup>. A small flock of 20 were recorded on the Hoe on the 6<sup>th</sup> of November.

### SONG THRUSH Turdus philomelos

Winter visitor, passage migrant

Four on the 1<sup>st</sup> of January, 6 on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3 on the 24<sup>th</sup>. 1-2 recorded throughout February. One on four dates in March. Just the one sighting in April. 1-2 throughout May, June July and August. One on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of September. Three were recorded on the 8<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> of October and 6 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Five on the 6<sup>th</sup> of November and 7 on the 22<sup>nd</sup>. Mainly 1-2 throughout December but 6 noted on the 14<sup>th</sup>.

No breeding records this year.

### **REDWING** Turdus illacus

Winter visitor

Two on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> of January, One on the 11<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. 3 on the 28<sup>th</sup> of February. The last of the outgoing birds was 1 on the 5<sup>th</sup> of March. First birds of the autumn were 6 on the 8<sup>th</sup> of October, singles on the 13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> and two on the 20<sup>th</sup>. An influx of 200 was recorded on the 6<sup>th</sup> of November, 11 on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 10 on the 8<sup>th</sup>. Singles on four other dates. One on the 12<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> of December.

### GRASSHOPPER WARBLER Locustella naevia

Scarce passage migrant

The only sighting of this species on the Hoe this year was of 1 on the 15<sup>th</sup> of September

### SEDGE WARBLER Acrocephalus schoenobaenus

Scarce assage migrant

Only two records during the autumn migration period and they were of 1 on the 25<sup>th</sup> of July and the other on the 26<sup>th</sup> of August.

### **REED WARBLER** Acrocephalus scripaceus

Scarce passage migrant

First of the returning birds was recorded on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of August, then 1 on the 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>, A Single on the 10<sup>th</sup> of September was the last sighting of the year on the Hoe.

### **LESSER WHITETHROAT** Sylvia curruca

Summer visitor, passage migrant

Three on the 16<sup>th</sup> of April were the first birds of the year followed by 2 on the 25<sup>th</sup>. 2 were noted on the 7<sup>th</sup> of May plus singles on seven other dates. During June singles were recorded on four dates. In July there were 2 on the 24<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>.

2 on the 13<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> of Aug and 3 on the 24<sup>th</sup>. Two on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> of September and the last sighting of the autumn was of 1 on the 14<sup>th</sup> of September.

### **COMMON WHITETHROAT** Sylvia communis

Summer visitor and passage migrant

First of the spring arrivals were 2 on the 12<sup>th</sup> of April followed by 5 on the 19<sup>th</sup>, 4 on the 25<sup>th</sup> and 5 on the 26<sup>th</sup>. Six records in May, the highest days totals being 7 on the 5<sup>th</sup>, and 6 on the 10<sup>th</sup>. Two double figure counts in June, 10 on the 14<sup>th</sup> and 12 on the 20<sup>th</sup>. Double figure counts continued in July with 12 on the 19<sup>th</sup> and again in August with 16 on the 17<sup>th</sup>, 17 on the 24<sup>th</sup>, 13 on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 10 on the 31<sup>st</sup>. Numbers fell away in September with 3 on five dates, 4 on three dates and then 7 on the 14<sup>th</sup>. Last birds of the autumn were 2 on October the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 1 on the 5<sup>th</sup>.

### GARDEN WARBLER Sylvia borin

Scarce passage migrant

1 seen on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of August proved to be the only record of the year.

### **BLACKCAP** Sylvia atricapilla

Passage migrant

First record of the year was of one in Woody Gully on the 27<sup>th</sup> of March followed by another single bird on the 29<sup>th</sup>. Two were recorded on the 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> of April. First of the returning birds were noted in July with 1 on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>, 2 on the 26<sup>th</sup>. Numbers in August consisted of 3 on the 10<sup>th</sup>, 4 on the 23<sup>rd</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> increasing to 8 on the 31<sup>st</sup>. Four on the 14<sup>th</sup> of September. After the third week of September numbers increased with 24 on the 23<sup>rd</sup>, 8 on the 24<sup>th</sup>, 11 on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 6 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Highest totals recorded in October were 13 on the 7<sup>th</sup>, 18 on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 6 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. There was a single on the 1<sup>st</sup> of November and the last of the year was of 1 in Gate scrub on the 28<sup>th</sup> of November.

### CHIFFCHAFF Phylloscopus collybita

Summer visitor, passage migrant

One over-wintering bird was seen on the Hoe on 27 February. First of the spring migration was a single on 27 March followed by one on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Six were seen on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> of April plus singles on three dates. There were singles on six dates in July and five dates in August. Numbers increase in September with 7 on the 10<sup>th</sup>, 26 on the 15<sup>th</sup>, 33 on the 25<sup>th</sup> and 15 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. During the first two weeks of October there were 8 on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 7 on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 14 on the 8<sup>th</sup> and then 7 on the 26<sup>th</sup>. Last of the year were 3 on 5 November.

### WILLOW WARBLER Phylloscopus trochilus

Passage migrant

First sighting of the year was of a single on the 26<sup>th</sup> of March followed by 6 on the 7<sup>th</sup> of April and 2 on the 16<sup>th</sup>. One on the 8<sup>th</sup> of May. First of the returning birds were noted in August when 4 were seen on the 10<sup>th</sup>, 5 on the 14<sup>th</sup>, 15 on the 24<sup>th</sup> and 4 on the 27<sup>th</sup>. Singles on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> of September, 2 on the 14<sup>th</sup> and the last bird of the year was recorded on the 25<sup>th</sup> of September.

### **GOLDCREST** Regulus regulus

### Passage migrant

First record of the year was of 1 on the 12<sup>th</sup> of March, Singles on the 26<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> and 3 on the 17<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>. The only other spring record was of 1 on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of April. First birds of the autumn were 3 on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of September and 2 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Singles on the 8<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> of October, 2 on the 4<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>. One on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> of November were the last birds of the year.

### FIRECREST Regulus ignicapillus

### Scarce passage migrant

First sighting of the year was of 2 on <sup>nd</sup> April. No other records until October when 1 was recorded on the 25<sup>th</sup> then 3 on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 2 on the 29<sup>th</sup>. One picked up dead on the seawall on the 12<sup>th</sup> of November. Last of the year was a single on 19 November.

### SPOTTED FLYCATCHER Muscicapa striata

### Scarce passage migrant


Just the one record this year and that was of 1 on 24 August.




One seen with fledged young on 27 May, Family party of 6 on 13 June. Numbers increased during the last five months of the year.



### Passage bird



Two on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> of January. Two flying west on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> of February. Single recorded on eight dates during March. Two on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of April 1 flying west on the 4<sup>th</sup>, one flying east on the 9<sup>th</sup> 2 on the 10<sup>th</sup> and 1 on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>. Two flew east on the 8<sup>th</sup> of May and 5 flew west on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of June. Two going west along the cliff face on the 12<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> of August. Two flying west on the 14<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> of September. Two were noted flying west on the 5<sup>th</sup> of October and then again on the 11<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>, Two going east on the 31<sup>st</sup>. Two recorded on five dates in November. Two over the Hoe on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of December and one on the 17<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>.

### **STARLING** Sturnus vulgaris

Winter visitor, passage migrant

Starlings no longer breed on the Hoe. No records for the first four months of the year. Six on the 30<sup>th</sup> of May and 18 on the following day. A flock of 80+ which consisted of many juveniles on the 21<sup>st</sup> of June. 30+ on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> of July. Numbers increased in August with 400 on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 100 on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>, and 300 on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>. Just the one record in September and that was of 8 on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. 80 flew east on the 28<sup>th</sup> of October. Incoming migrants were noted in November with 170 in off the sea on the 5<sup>th</sup>, 23 on the 6<sup>th</sup> and 180 on the 7<sup>th</sup>. The only record for December was of 1 on the 12<sup>th</sup>.

### **HOUSE SPARROW** Passer domesticus

Uncommon visitor

One on 23 and 24 September, then again on 25 October and 27 November.

### TREE SPARROW Passer montanus

Rare

One on 14 October.

### **CHAFFINCH** Fringilla coelebs

Resident, passage migrant

One on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of February. Five flew east on the 12<sup>th</sup> of March 1 on the Hoe on the 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. Two on the 11<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> of April .Between May and August there were only two records of a single bird. Incoming migrants lifted the numbers in September with 6 on the 20<sup>th</sup>, 7 on the 23<sup>rd</sup> 8 on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 12 on the 27<sup>th</sup>. Good numbers for the Hoe in October with 16 on the 9<sup>th</sup>, 13 on the 12<sup>th</sup>, 11 on the 25<sup>th</sup> and 9 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Seven on the 1<sup>st</sup> of November and 5 on four other dates. 1-2 throughout December but 8 were recorded on the 21<sup>st</sup>.

#### **GREENFINCH** Carduelis chloris

Scarce visitor

One flew east on the 28<sup>th</sup> of March, 2 recorded on the 5<sup>th</sup> of November.

### **GOLDFINCH** Carduelis carduelis

Mainly a passage bird

Five flew east on the 26<sup>th</sup> of March and 2 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Four seen to come in off the sea on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of April. Two seen on the Hoe on four other dates during the month. Two adults plus one young on the 30<sup>th</sup> of May. Six were recorded on the 27<sup>th</sup> of June and 5 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Six on the 12<sup>th</sup> of July and 4 on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>, Just a single sighting in August. 8 on the 29<sup>th</sup> of September. 49 flew west over the Hoe on the 12<sup>th</sup> of October and 45 going east on the 14<sup>th</sup>. A large movement was noted on the 28<sup>th</sup> with 822 flying west over the site. On the 5<sup>th</sup> of November 170 flew east over the Hoe and a further 120 also going east on the 7<sup>th</sup>, 40 on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>. Last birds of the year were two on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of December.

### **SISKIN** Carduelis spinus

### Regular passage migrant


Easterly movement noted during March with 6 on the 15<sup>th</sup>, 15 on the 25<sup>th</sup>, 25 on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 85 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. Autumn movements began on the 14<sup>th</sup> of September with 13 flying west, then 65 moving east on the 28<sup>th</sup>. 100 flew west on the 11<sup>th</sup> of October, 50 going east on the 14<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> then 562 again going east on the 28<sup>th</sup>. During November 35 flew west on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 116 went east on the 5<sup>th</sup>, 80 on the 6<sup>th</sup>, 10 on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 125 on the 8<sup>th</sup>. Other sightings in November were 14 on the 13<sup>th</sup>, 10 on the 15<sup>th</sup>, 13 on the 16<sup>th</sup> and 5 on the 20<sup>th</sup>.

### LINNET Carduelis cannabina

Summer visitor and passage migrant

First birds of the spring were 2 on 22 March. Highest days totals during the year were 58 on 31 August, 59 flying west on 27 September and 50 going west on 12 October. Last birds of the year were 35 going west on 5 November.

### **REDPOLL** spp

All the records are of unidentified birds flying over the Hoe and they are 2 on 12 October, 30 on 5 November, 5 on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 3 on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

13 flew east on 29 October and 1 on 7 November.

### **LAPLAND BUNTING** Calcarius lapponicus

Rare

One reported over the Hoe on 6 October.

## **SNOW BUNTING** Plectrophenax nivalis Rare winter visitor

One on the seawall on 8 November.

## **YELLOWHAMMER** Emberiza citrinella Recorded from time to time

One on the 15<sup>th</sup> of November.

### **REED BUNTING** Emberiza schoeniclus

Occaisional visitor

One on five dates in March. One male on 4 April, and a female on 15 June. The only other records are of 1 on 5 August and 15 November.

### **CORN BUNTING** Millaaria calandra

Rare

One reported on 21 August.
