WHAT YOU NEED

Bottle cap
Card and paper (ask for some from the recycling bin)
Scissors, sticky tape, glue and thread

LEARN

1. Name an animal which lives in a nest?
2. Name 5 animals which live in trees. Did you know animals adapted to live in trees, like having a long tail to dangle from, are called arboreal?
3. What are the following animal's homes called: badger, fox, squirrel and beaver?

Do

1. Do you share your home with any creatures? Maybe a spider, a fly or a bird nesting on your roof? Go on a hunt to spot them.
2. Lots of things in our homes were originally found in the wild such as wood, stone, glass (made from sand), wool, cotton and leather. Can you find items made from these wild things in your home?

MAKE

A dangly spider. Cut 8 pieces of card then tape them to the underside of your bottle cap to make legs, bending them into shape. Cut out 2 paper circles and add dots in the middle. Stick these on your cap to make eyes. Attach a piece of thread for your spider to dangle from. Why not hide your spider and see if anyone in your household spots it! Share a picture with the rangers:
