SAMPHIRE HOE BIRD REPORT 2015







Samphire Hoe is owned by Eurotunnel and managed together with the White Cliffs Countryside Partnership

The recording of the birds of Samphire Hoe provides information about the site's ecological development, its use as a migratory stopping point and a wintering ground.

The birds of Samphire Hoe are recorded on a casual basis by general observations. The breeding birds are monitored by an annual Common Bird Census, this plots out bird territories. The recording area is the Hoe itself, the sea, the cliffs behind the Hoe and the east and west ends.

123 species were recorded in 2015, 25 species held territory in the recording area. The bird report includes a monthly summary and then a systematic list of species seen during the year. The information give under the species name is the bird's status at Samphire Hoe.

Thanks go to Derek Smith who has compiled the report and all the contributors, in particular all the volunteer Rangers, Phil Smith, Tony Prentice, Roger Card and Les Collins, and also to all the other observers including Ian Roberts and Geoff Burton.

SAMPHIRE BIRD REPORT

SUMMARY FOR 2015

January

Five **Red Throated Divers** flew East on the 4th, a **Shag** on the 5th. A **Firecrest** was noted on the 7th. A flock of 40 **Meadow Pipits** on the 8th and 143 flew East past the Hoe on the 20th, 6 **Stonechats** recorded also on the 20th. A single **Long Tailed Tit** noted on the 22nd. A **Great Skua** was seen offshore on the 25th and a **Raven** flew by also on the 25th. 30 **Rock Pipits** on the West beach on the 25th and 26th.

FEBRUARY

Three **Fieldfare** recorded on the 4th. One **Hen Harrier** reported from on the seawall on the 8th. 16 **Great Crested Grebes** offshore on the 11th and 16th, 16 **Fulmar** noted at rest on the sea on the 11th plus one **Brambling** on the Hoe. 26 **Red Throated Divers** flew East on the 13th plus **192 Brents. Raven** noted on the 14th. Three **Peregrines** on the 23rd.

MARCH

The first **Wheatear** of the spring was recorded on the 8th, a single noted on the 10th. A **Chiffchaff**, the first of the spring was also recorded on the 8th. Three **Peregrines** at the Eastern end of the Hoe on the 10th, also a **Sparrowhawk** was recorded on the same day. 2 **Buzzards** on the 11th and 12th. Single **Red Legged Partridge** on the 16th, 22nd and 24th. Two **Shag** offshore on the 17th, 2 **Rock Pipit** of the species *Littoralis* were recorded from on the West beach on the 16th also seen on the 17th. 110 **Brents** flew East also on the 17th. 6 **Common Gulls** flew past on the 31st.

APRIL

A **Firecrest** recorded on the 4th and 5th, 2 **Swallows** on the 6th were the first of the year, six **Shelduck** flew North. The first **Blackcap** of the spring was noted on the 7th. A female **Ring Ouzel** was found on the 10th and 3 **Little Egrets** flew East. First **Sandwich Terns** recorded on the 12th, 80 **Common Scoter** flew East on the 17th and the three **House Martins** seen on the same day were the first of the year. Two **Common Whitethroats** noted on the 21st were the first of the spring arrivals, 5 **Whimbrels** seen on the 22nd. A **Black Throated Diver** seen offshore on the 23rd. The first **Willow Warbler** was recorded on the 21st. 2 **Buzzards** on the 30th.

MAY

A Merlin was seen to come in off the sea on the 1st, a Yellow Wagtail flew over on the 2nd. 15 Gannets offshore on the 3rd. A Manx Shearwater flew west on the on the 5th. Three pairs of Stonechats recorded feeding young on the 6th. 5 Swallows in off the sea on the 7th, the first Swifts of the year were also recorded on that day also the first Lesser Whitethroat. On the 11th 1 Turnstone, 3 Whimbrel and 52 Common Scoter were all seen to be moving East. The first Reed Warbler appeared on the 12th. Pair of Meadow Pipits feeding young on the 15th as were a pair of Rock Pipits. Two Shags offshore on the 15th. A Red Breasted Merganser flew East on the 15th. A Common Sandpiper recorded on the 21st. Two Greenfinches noted on the 24th.

JUNE

A single **Pheasant** seen on the 5th and 2 **Manx Shearwaters** flew past on the 6th. Two **Black Redstarts** and 3 juveniles recorded from the east end of the Hoe on the 9th. A **Hobby** noted over the Hoe on the 14th plus a **Red Backed Shrike** was reported to be on site. Two **Teal** recorded on the 15th. 50+ **House Martins** on the 18th. More than 40 **Swifts** flew west on the 23rd. A **Great Spotted Woodpecker** recorded on the Hoe on the 25th and a single **Chiffchaff** on the 30th.

JULY

First of the returning **Wheatears** seen on the 1st. A **Hobby** was recorded on three dates this month. 115 **Swifts** flew west on the 14th. A **Reed Warbler** turned up on the 28th and a **Whimbrel** flew West on the same day. A **Spotted Flycatcher** recorded on the 30th.

AUGUST

Two **House Sparrows** on the 4th, 6 **Ravens** and 1 **Hobby** on the 9th. A **Grasshopper Warbler** noted on the 15th followed by a **Garden Warbler on the 17th.** C.150 **Starlings** on the 18th. Six **Wheatears** recorded on the 19th. A **Great Spotted Woodpecker** the second of the year was logged on the 22nd, 30 **Med Gull** seen on the same day. Three **Yellowhammers**, a rare visitor to the Hoe were recorded on the 28th. Six **Whinchat** noted on the 30th.

SEPTEMBER

Twelve **Wheatears** were present on the Hoe on the 1st, 1 **Swift** flew west and a **Grasshopper Warbler** was recorded plus 6 **Lesser Whitethroats.** A **Kingfisher** was noted on the west beach on the 2nd. One **Jay** recorded on the 6th. On the 7th 2 **Spotted Flycatchers** were logged along with 6 **Black Redstarts** and a **Wood Warbler**. Three **Common Sandpipers** observed on the 9th. 128 **Siskins** flew east on the 11th. 5 **Willow Warblers** noted on the13th along with a **Firecrest** and 2 **Sand Martins**. Estimated 10,000 **Swallows** moved west during the morning of the 19th, 6 **Ravens** present also on the19th. Three **Whinchat** on the 16th and 14 **Chiffchaff** noted on the 20th.

OCTOBER

160 **Siskins** flew east on the 6th. A male **Bullfinch** noted on the 8th. 35 **Ring Ouzels** present on the Hoe on the 9th. A late **Lesser Whitethroat** and a **Hobby** recorded on the 19th. A **Dartford Warbler** was found on the Hoe on the18th and was last seen on the 20th and a **Red Breasted Flycatcher** turned up on the 20th. Seven **Black Redstarts** recorded on the 27th.

NOVEMBER

A **Short Eared Owl** was present on the Hoe on seven different days up until the 17th. A **Shag** was present offshore on the 10th and 28th. Good numbers of **Robins** still present around the Hoe, **Ravens** seen on six dates. An unusual bird in the way of a **Ring Necked Parakeet** was seen flying east past the Hoe on the 24th.

DECEMBER

A **Shag** offshore on the 1st and 8th. 3 **Chiffchaffs** and one **Fieldfare** on the 15th. **Raven** displaying along the cliff face on the 12th, 35 **Rock Pipits** on the west beach on the 16th. **Black Redstart** noted on the 21st and 28th. A **Barn Owl** recorded on the 24th close to the tunnel entrance to Samphire Hoe. 30 **Common Gulls** flew West on the 27th. A **Water Rail** was discovered by the log pile on the 28th.



First bird of the year was a single on the 7th of April followed by one on the 8th, Two were seen on the 13th and 14th. One on the 25th of May. Single sighting on the 4th and again on the 14th of June. Not recorded again until late July when two were noted. One on the 2nd, 10th and 15th of August and 5 on the 31st. Numbers moving through the Hoe increased in September with 12 on the 1st, 11 on the 2nd, 20 on the 7th and 16 on the 22nd dropping back to 4 on the 29th. Three double figure days in October and they were 20 on the 3rd, 11 on the 4th and 12 on the 9th. The last of the autumn migration appeared to be the 7 recorded on the 12th of October. One territory held.



One seen at the West end of the Hoe on the 7th of April, 1-2 throughout April at the eastern end of the Hoe, heard in song in the security compound. Heard in song at the western end on five dates, 2 seen on the 15th and 16th. 2 plus 3 juveniles noted on the 9th of June, 3 young on the 10th. One recorded at the west end on the 12th. Female plus 3 juveniles on the 23rd, Female feeding 2 young on the 27th. 2 noted on six dates in July, 3 on the 14th. One feeding fledged young on the 27th, 6 recorded on the 28th. 4 recorded on five dates in August, 5 on the 19th. 7 on the 1st and 9th of September, 1-4 during later part of the month. 6/8 on the 6th of October, 6 on the 20th and 7 on the 27th, 2-3 on eight other dates. One recorded on the 9th of November. One on the 21st and 28th of December.

BRAMBLING Fringilla moutifringilla Scarce winter visitor One on the 11th of February. One on the 12th and 17th of October, 2 on the 18th followed by 4 on the 19th.

BRENT GOOSE Branta Bernicla Common passage migrant 16 flew East on the 4th of January then 143 on the 20th. Easterly movement continued into February with 192 on the 13th and 20 recorded on the 14th. Further Easterly movements noted in March with 40 on the 3rd and 10th, 1,168 on the 13th, 110 on the 17th and 30 0n the 30th. 220 flew East on the 5th of April, 70 flew East on the 10th then smaller movements of between 16 and 28 on three other days. 100 flew East on the 29th of April. The last of the spring migration was one on the 7th of May. First of the autumn returning birds were 2 on the 27th and 28th of September. 60 passed the Hoe on the 12th of October, 7 flew east on the 13th and 29 on the 20th. 4 recorded on the 23rd of November. 3 on the 14th and 15th of December then 3 East on the 31st.

BULLFINCH Pyrrhula pyrrhula Uncommon on the Hoe One in Gate Scrub on the 8th of October.

CHAFFINCH Fringilla coelebs

One on the 15th and 25th of January Two on the 25th. One on the 10th of February. Two on the 17th of March and again on the 12th and 16th of April. Single on the 16th of May. One on the 11th and 22nd of September Two on the 26th. Five on the 17th of October and 7 on the 27th. 1-3 during November 7 on the 27th. 6 on the 28th of December.

CHIFFCHAFF Phylloscopus collybita Passage migrant First bird of the year was on the 8th of March followed later by one on the 17th and 22nd, 6 recorded on the 24th and 2 on the 28th. Singles on several dates during April, 3 on the 6th. One noted on the 30th of June. Two on the 10th and 18th of August. 1-3 recorded on nine dates in September and 14 noted on the 25th. A movement of birds through the Hoe was recorded in October with 16 on the 3rd, 14 on the 4th and 25+ on the 9th. 1-3 recorded during the rest of the month. Three on the 10th of November. The last record of the year was of 3 on the 7th of December.

COMMON BUZZARD Buteo buteo

An unusual visitor/Passage bird

Two flew over on the 11th of March followed by 1 on the 12th. 2 flew past on the 30th of April, One on the 24th of May. Singles were again recorded on the 19th of July, 2nd and 28th of August, 7th and 19th of September 3rd of October and the 28th of November.

COMMON GULL Larus canus Passage migrant Two offshore on the 16th and 17th of February, 12 flying West on the 19th. 4 flew West on the 3rd of March, 3 on the 30th and 6 on the 31st. One on the 14th of April. 2 on the 27th of July followed by one on the 28th and 29th. Single sightings on the 9th, 16th, 24th and 30th of November. 35 recorded on the 7th of December and 30 flew West on the 27th.

COMMON REDSTART Phoenicurus phoenicurus Passage migrant First birds of the autumn migration were singles on the 5^{th} , 7^{th} , 19^{th} and 22^{nd} of September. No other records.

COMMON SANDPIPER Actitis hypoleucos Passage migrant First passage bird of the year was noted on the 21^{st} of May. First of the returning birds were 2 on the 17^{th} of August followed by one on the 19^{th} and 31^{st} . Last birds of the year were 3 on the 9^{th} of September.


COMMON SCOTER *Melanitta nigra*390 flew East on the 5th of April. Two flocks flew East on the 10th but no numbers were logged. Easterly movement noted later in the month with 80 recorded on the 17th, 25 on the 18th and then 4 on the 29th. 30 moving up channel on the 4th of May and 52 moving East on the 11th. The first bird of the autumn was of a single flying West on the 1st of October, 25 flew East on the 3rd.

First birds of the spring were 4 on the 7th of May followed by 10 on the 5th. One seen to come in off the sea on the 13th, 2 on the 25th. 8 recorded on the 8th of June, 40 on the 22nd and 15 on the 23rd. 115 were observed moving west along the cliff tops on the 14th of July, 4 noted on the 27th. More than 20 on the 3rd of August plus 3 going West on the 5th. Last sighting of the year was of a single on the 1st of September.

COMMON TERN Sterna hirundo Passage migrant 3 East on the 11th of May, 2 on the 21st of July.

COMMON WHITETHROAT Sylvia communis Passage/breeder First birds of the spring were 2 on the 21st of April followed by 3 on the 23rd, 2 recorded on the 24th and 28th. Three on the 2nd of May and 2 on the 25th, singles recorded on seven other dates during the month. Two on the 6th and 14th of June, 4 juveniles and one adult on the 23rd. Two on five dates in July, 4 on the 20th. 2-4 on eleven dates in August, 5 on the 25th and 22 on the 31st. Small movement continued in September with 40+ on the 1st, 12 on the 2nd and 9 on the 5th. Two on the 17th and 22nd and the last of the autumn was a single on the 30th of September.

CORMORANT



132 flew East on the 7th of February, 100 West on the 13th and 37 East on the 17th.

CURLEW Numenius aequata Passage migrant One on the 13^{th} of January and again on the 13^{th} of February. One flew west on the 1^{st} and 11^{th} of May. Three flew West on the 22^{nd} of June. One on the 24^{th} of July and on the 7^{th} of September.

DARTFORD WARBLER Sylvia undata Scarce passage migrant One found on the Hoe on the 18th of October this individual remained for a further two days before disappearing.



FIRECREST Regulus ignicapilla Passage migrant One recorded in Woody Gulley on the 7th of January. One heard on the 4th of April followed by a single sighting on the 5th. First birds of the autumn were singles on the 13th and 20th of September. One recorded on the 1st of October then again on the 20th, 24th and 26th, 2 on the 31st.

FULMAR Fulmaris glacialis Resident/Summer breeder 6 on the 13th and 31st of January, 8 on the 20th. 2-3 birds throughout February plus 5 on the 10th and 24th and 16 on the 11th. 10 on the 10th of March and 6 on the 24th. 11 present along the cliffs on the 7th of April, 6 on the 28th. 2 on the 3rd and 4th of May. 4 on the 1st of June then a count of 2 throughout the rest of the month. 3 on the 6th of July, 2 on the 13th and 19th, 3 on the 3rd of August, 2 on the 10th plus a single sighting on four other dates. Two on the 1st of September, then 1 on the 2nd. Last bird of the summer noted on the 16th of September. First of the returning birds were 6 on the 14th of December, 8 on the 15th, 1 on the 17th and 19th and 3 on the 21st No evidence of breeding this year.

GANNET Morus bassanus Winter visitor/Passage migrant Three on the 5th, 26th and 27th of January, 6 on the 20th, 58 offshore on the 28th of January. 20 offshore on the 11th of February, 730 flew East on the 13th and 10 on the 21st. 20 offshore on the 11th of March. 22 offshore on the 11th of April 28 flew East on the 28th. 15 seen offshore on the 3rd of May. Five flew East on the 2nd of July, 17 seen offshore on the 13th 8 on the 14th and 9 on the 28th. 5 recorded on the 25th of August. One on the 1st of September. 2 going West on the 3rd of October. 8 offshore on the13th. Single sightings on the 14th and 24th of November. 6 on the 8th of December, 3 on the 10th, 4 on the 11th and one on the 28th.

GARDEN WARBLER Sylvia borin Passage migrant One on the 17th of August and the 7th of September.

GOLDCREST Regulus regulus Passage migrant
The only spring record was of one on the 6th of April. Just before the
autumn, 2 were noted on the 16th of September and 4 on the 29th,
1-2 were recorded on seven other dates during the month. Autumn
passage was noticeable during October with 18 recorded on the 3rd,
16 on the 18th and 15 on the 19th, 26th and 31st. Just a single on two
dates in November. Through December, singles were recorded on six
dates and 2 on the 28th.


GOLDEN PLOVER Pluvialis apricaria Passage migrant One flew East on the 12th of October.

One on the 17th and 25th of January. One on the 3rd of February. 15 on the 26th of April. During May, June and July numbers seen never exceeded two. Not much change in August and September with just 20 on the 21st of August otherwise just 1-3 being recorded. Easterly movements noted in October with 55 on the 1st of October, 155 on the 12th and a large movement of 2,500 on the 18th. 65 East on the 19th. 8 flew West on the 11th of November, 12 on the 17th and 23rd. One on the 1st of December.



GRASSHOPPER WARBLER Locustella naevia Scarce passage migrant One on the 15^{th} of August and then again on the 1^{st} of September.

GREAT CRESTED GREBE Podiceps cristatus

Mainly a winter visitor

One on three dates in January. 16 offshore on the 11th of February and 10 on the 16th. One seen offshore on six dates during March plus 2 on the 17th and 30th and 6 on the 24th. Two on the 5th of April, 3 on the 6th and 5 on the 7th. One on the 3rd of May. First birds of the winter were 2 on the 23rd of November. One on the 9th of December and 2 on the 21st.

GREAT SKUA Stercorarius skua

Passage migrant

One offshore on the 21^{st} of January, 1 flew East on the 13^{th} of February. The only other sighting was of 1 on the 17^{th} of April.

GREAT SPOTTED WOODPECKER Dendrocopos minor

Passage bird

One on the 25th of June followed by one on the 22nd of August. The next records were singles on the 3rd and 18th of October.

GREAT TIT Parus major

Resident

4 on the 30th January, but the average for the month was between 1 and 2. Throughout the spring and summer months, sightings ranged between one and two. Three recorded on the 1st of September, 1-2 on several other dates. Four recorded on the 5th of October and for the remaining weeks of the year numbers ranged between one and two.

GREENFINCH Chloris chloris Two on the 24th of May.

GREEN WOODPECKER *Picus viridis Mainly a winter visitor* First records of the year were of a single bird on the 3rd, 8th, 9th and 13th of September. Three single sightings in October and 4 in November. One on the 1st and 8th of December.

GREY HERON Ardea cinerea Passage bird One flew over on the 17th of February and again on the 10th of April. Not recorded again until one flew past the Hoe on the 22nd and 28th of August. 2 recorded on the 10th of September, 1 flew East on the 15th and 28th. Just the single sighting in October. One over the Hoe on the 20th and 30th of November. Single sightings on four dates during December.

GREY PLOVER Pluvialis squatarola One flew East on the 5th of April.

Passage migrant

GREY WAGTAIL Motacilla cinerea Passage bird One on the 5^{th} , 17^{th} and 18^{th} of January. One on the 17^{th} of August. Single flew over on the 11^{th} and 13^{th} of September followed by 2 on the 20^{th} . One recorded on the 14^{th} of October and again on the 9^{th} and 14^{th} of November.

GUILLEMOT/RAZORBILL *Uria aalge/alca torda Winter visitor* Not reported off the Hoe during the first four months of the year, it was not a very cold winter but still unusual not to have late winter sightings. On the 10th of May one Razorbill and 3 Guillemots were recorded. 9 Guillemots reported offshore on the 20th of December plus one Razorbill, 38 Auk spp flew West, these were mainly Guillemots. One Guillemot off Samphire Hoe on the 27th.

HOBBY Falco subbuteo Summer visitor One on the 14^{th} of June. Single recorded on the 20^{th} , 29^{th} and 30^{th} of July. One over the main pond on the 9^{th} of August and a late sighting of a single on the 19^{th} of October.

First birds of the year were 3 on the 17th of April followed by 2 on the 21st and 5 on the 27th. Numbers increased in May with 20 being recorded on the 12th and 25th, 30 on the 17th. Highest count noted in June was 50 on the 16th. 30 recorded on the 21st and 28th of July. August saw numbers increase to more than 50 on the 4th and 22nd, more than 100 on the 17th and 31st. c.600 on the 5th of September, more than 100 on the 9th and 15th. 8,000 reported flying West on the 19th. 40 flew East on the 18th and 19th of October and 20 on the 20th appeared to be the last of the year at Samphire Hoe.

One recorded on many dates during the first five months of the year. Two noted on the 27^{th} of June followed by 1-2 throughout July and August. Four recorded on the 5^{th} , 27^{th} and 29^{th} of September, 5 on the 17^{th} and 28^{th} . During October numbers recorded were 6 on the 6^{th} followed by 7 on the 8^{th} , the average count for the month was between 2 and 4. Up to 2 throughout November and December but 3 were recorded on the 1^{st} of December.

KINGFISHER Alcedo atthis

Scarce passage migrant

One recorded from the west beach on the 2nd of September.

KITTIWAKE Rissa tridactyla

Passage migrant

An uncommon bird off the Hoe this year with just 3 reported sightings and they were, 1 on the 6th of January, 10 flying East on the 11th of February and a single offshore on the 26th of May.

LAPWING Vanellus vanellus

Five on the 16th of February then 1 on the 17th.



Single sightings on three dates during July. Birds appeared to be moving through the Hoe in August with 3 on the 5^{th} and 14^{th} , one on the 10^{th} and 15^{th} and 2 on the 22^{nd} and 28^{th} , 5 recorded on the 31^{st} . Six noted on the 1^{st} of September, 3 on the 6^{th} , 7^{th} and 16^{th} and 2 on the 20^{th} . One recorded on the 1^{st} and 2nd of October and the last of the year was of a single on the 19^{th} of October.

The next records were in April with 3 on the 13th and 2 on the 14th. One of the Greenland race was noted on the 27th. Three recorded on the 29th. One on the 5th, 7th and 21st of May. First of the returning birds was a single on the 1st of July. Not recorded again until one was seen on the 10th and 14th of August then 6 on the 17th and 18th followed by 5 on the 25th and 4 on the 31st. Small movement on the 1st September with 12 being recorded. 6 on the 5th, 20th and 29th. 1-2 on fourteen other dates during the month. Single sightings on eight dates in October. The last birds of the year were 2 on the 20th.



OYSTERCATCHER Haematopus ostralegus Passage bird One flew past on the 26th of January. One on the 13th of February. Two East on the 17th of March and the 25th of April. One West on the 9th of June. 6 flew West past the Hoe on the 4th of August followed by 2 going East on the 21st.

PEREGRINE FALCON Falco peregrinus Resident breeder Two on the 6th, 13th, 19th and 20th of January at the East end of the Hoe, 2 recorded from the West end on the 26th. 1-2 at the East end of the Hoe throughout February, March and April, 3 noted on the 23rd of February and on the 10th of March. Mating recorded on the 15th of April. 1-2 throughout May, June and July at the Eastern end with 2 recorded from the West end on the 1st of July. No evidence of successful breeding. For the remaining five months of the year numbers remained between one and two, 3 on the 7th of December.

PHEASANT Phasianus colchicus Occasional visitor Single on the 5^{th} and 11^{th} of June. A break of about three months before the next record which was of 1 on the 28^{th} of September. Pair recorded on the 6^{th} of October. Single on five dates during November. One on the 1^{st} of December and 2 on the 11^{th} .

PIED WAGTAIL Motacilla alba yarrelli Passage migrant

One on the 25th of May. Next records were not until August when one was recorded on the 1st and 14th then one in September on the 28th and 29th. 3 were seen on the 3rd of October, 2 flew East on the 5th. 3 East on the 18th, 2 on the 22nd and 3 on the 25th. Single seen on six dates in November and eight dates in December.

PINTAIL Anas acuta

5 flew East on the 9th of March. One on the 5th of April.

RAVEN Corvus corax

Regular visitor

One on the 25^{th} of Jan and again on the 14^{th} of February. Three on the 5^{th} and 8^{th} of March. Single sightings on seven dates during April and 2 on four other dates. Two on the 2^{nd} and 8^{th} of May. Two on the 31^{st} of July. One on seven dates during August, 2 on the 5^{th} , 17^{th} and 19^{th} . Four on the 2^{nd} and 5^{th} of September, 6 on the 19^{th} , there were twelve other sightings of between 1 and 3 during the month. 2 to 3 on many dates during October and November. Similar numbers recorded in December.

RED BREASTED MERGANSER Mergus serrater Passage migrant One recorded on the 15th of May. 3 flew Wet on the 15th of May.

RED LEGGED PARTRIDGE Alectoris rufa Occasional visitor One on the 16th, 22nd and 24th of March. One on the 5th of April and then one on the 22nd of August.

REDPOLL Carduelis flammea sp

1 flew East on the 4^{th} of October, $\dot{6}$ going East on the 12^{th} and 4 on the 18^{th} .

RED THROATED DIVER Gavia stellata Winter visitor 5 flew East on the 4th of January. Easterly movement noted on the 13th of February with 26 flying past the Hoe followed by 12 on the 14th. A single on the 3rd of March and 6 flying East on the 11th and 16 on the 13th. 4 flew East on the 5th of April and 1 on the 11th were the last spring sightings.

REDWING Turdus iliacus Winter visitor First of the autumn were 3 on the 15^{th} of October, 5 recorded on the 18^{th} and 19^{th} and 8 on the 20^{th} . Just the one record for November and that was of 1 on the 28^{th} .



REED BUNTING Emberiza schoeniclus Passage bird One on the 20th of September. One flew East on the 18th of October followed by 1 on the 26th.



ROBIN Erithacus rubecula Mainly winter visitor and passage migrant. Has bred in the past.



SANDWICH TERN Sterna sandvicensis Passage migrant First birds of the year were 2 on the 9th of April followed by 3 on the 10th, 10 East on the 11th of April, 5 on the 12th, 2 on the 13th and 1 on the 29th. 7 flew East on the 10th of May, 5 on the 11th. Quiet autumn passage with just a single on the 3rd of August, 7 West on the7th of September followed by 3 on the 9th, 2 on the 17th of September followed by 4 on the 27th.

SEDGE WARBLER Acrocephalus schoenobaenus Passage migrant Two recorded on the 5th of August, One on the 1st and 20th of September.

SHAG Phalacrocorax aristotelis Winter visitor One on the 5^{th} of January. Single on six dates in February. One on the 16^{th} and 28^{th} of March and 2 on the 17^{th} . Single sightings on the 22^{nd} and 28^{th} of April. 2 on the 15^{th} of May. One on the 5^{th} , 6^{th} and 13^{th} of October and two on the 17^{th} and 27^{th} . Single sightings on the 10^{th} and 28^{th} of November then again on the 1^{st} and 8^{th} of December.

SHELDUCK Tadorna Tadorna Passage migrant One flew west past the Hoe on the $1^{\rm st}$ of January. 5 flew past on the $9^{\rm th}$ of February and 3 on the $16^{\rm th}$. 6 flew East on the $6^{\rm th}$ of April. 2 flew West on the $25^{\rm th}$. 2 flew West on the $7^{\rm th}$ of May then 4 on the $11^{\rm th}$. The next record was of one flying West on the $9^{\rm th}$ of September then 1 on the $23^{\rm rd}$ of November.

SHORT EARED OWL Asio flammeus

Winter visitor

First bird of the winter was recorded on the 18^{th} of October followed by 2 on the 20^{th} 21^{st} and 25^{th} . One recorded on seven dates up until the 17^{th} of November.

SISKIN Carduelis spinus Passage migrant Six on the 9^{th} of September, 12 flew East on the 11^{th} then 30 East on the 13^{TH} and 16^{TH} . A further 55 flew East on September the 29^{th} . 160 East on the 6^{th} of October, 70 on the 15^{th} , 125 on the 18^{th} then 40 on the 19^{th} .

SKYLARK Alauda arvensis

Resident breeder

One seen to come in off the sea on the 10th of February, one on the 25th of February and the 24th of March. 1-3 throughout June, 3 on the 23rd and 28th. 1-3 throughout July with one seen carrying food on the 21st. A single recorded on five dates in August, 2 on the 7th. 5 on the 20th of September. 2 on the 4th and 20th of October, 4 in off the sea on the 18th.

SONG THRUSH *Turdus philomelos Passage migrant/winter visitor* One on five dates in January, 4 on the 20^{th} . 1-3 throughout February. Single on four dates in March. One on the 6^{th} and 14^{th} of April. Not recorded again until a single bird was seen on the 22^{nd} of September. Two recorded on three dates in October, 4 on the 18^{th} and 6 on the 19^{th} and 20^{th} . Two noted on the 14^{th} of November then one on the 23^{rd} and 24^{th} , 3 on the 25^{th} . During December, numbers recorded were 3 on the 7^{th} and 15^{th} , 2 on the 28^{th} .


SPARROWHAWK Accipiter nisus

One recorded on the 10th of March followed by singles on the 6th, 7th and 20th of April. One noted on three dates in May and two dates in August. One recorded on five days in September and then three days in October and November. One on the 28th of December.

SPOTTED FLYCATCHER Muscicapa striata Scarce passage migrant First of the autumn migration was of 1 on the 31st of July, 1 on the 31st of August. One flew on the 6th of September, followed by 2 on the 7th.

Mainly absent this winter with just the one record of 8 on the 18th of January. One on the 16th of March. 4 on the 28th of May. Three records in June consisting of 6 on the 6th and 25th and 8 on the 16th. Numbers began to increase at the end of July with counts of 30 on the 26th, 60 on the 27th then c.100 on the 28th and 29th then c.80 on the 31st. Numbers remained high in August with counts of c.100 on five dates, c.120 on the 5th, c.150 on the 18th; Numbers dropped at the end of the month to 40 on the 25th and 20 on the 31st. During September numbers remained steady with 30 on the 1st, 50 on the 4th, 40 on the 27th. 30 were recorded on the 8th and 30th of October, 20 seen to come in off the sea on the 27^{th?} 10 on the 22nd of November. More than 70 on the 25th.

Two on the 10th and One on the 29th of February. Singles recorded on the 5th, 14th and 24th of March and again on the 21st and 28th of April. Two on the 16th of June and the 28th of July. One on the 1st of August and also on the 10th. No other reported sightings during the last four months of the year. *One pair at least held territory.*



3 pairs all with young on the 16^{th} of May, Female with 2 juveniles on the 11^{th} of June. One bird seen carrying food on the 15^{th} of July. A programme of colour ringing Stonechats was conducted during the summer with the standard B T O ring on the left leg and two coloured rings on the right several sightings have been made during the autumn of at least two of these birds.

Max of 4 pairs bred this year.



First birds of the year were 2 on the 6th of April followed by 4 on the 14th. 2 were seen to come in off the sea on the 17th. 4 on the 11th of May then 5 in off the sea on the 7th. Small numbers noted on several other dates. Just two records of singles in June. More than 20 on the 21st of July. More than 70 recorded on the 31st of August. A large westerly movement of 10,000 Hirundines consisting mainly of Swallows was observed on the morning of the 19th of September. In October 255 flew East on the 12th, 190 on the 18th, 200 on the 19th and 100 on the 20th. 10 flew West on the 23rd of October.

One seen by the log pile on the 28th of December. A new arrival?

WHIMBREL Numenius phaeopus Passage migrant Four flew East on the 17th of April followed by 5 on the 22nd. 3 going east on the 23rd, 2 on the 29th. One Eest on the 11th and 13th of May, 3 on the 12th. One flying West on the 28th of July.

WHINCHAT Saxicola rubetra Mainly an autumn passage migrant First of the autumn migration were 2 on the 14th of August, Singles on the 17th, 18th and 19th 3 on the 25th and 28th followed by 6 on the 31st. 1-5 recorded on fifteen dates during September mainly sightings of two but 5 recorded on the 16th and 3 on the 20th. Last bird of the year was noted on the 27th.

WHITE WAGTAIL Motacilla a alba Passage migrant Four Pied/ White flying east on the 1st of October One in off the sea on the 5th of October.

WIGEON Anus Penelope 4 flew East on the 5th of April.




