SAMPHIRE HOE BIRD REPORT 2014







Samphire Hoe is owned by Eurotunnel and managed together with the White Cliffs Countryside Partnership

The recording of the birds of Samphire Hoe provides information about the site's ecological development, its use as a migratory stopping point and a wintering ground. The birds of Samphire Hoe are recorded on a casual basis by general observations. The breeding birds are monitored by an annual Common Bird Census which plots out bird territories. The recording area is the Hoe itself, the sea, the cliffs behind the Hoe and the east and west ends.

118 species were recorded during the year, 16 species bred in the area plus a further 6 species did so just beyond the recording area. The bird report includes a monthly summary and then a systematic list of species seen in 2014. The information given under the species name is in the bird's status at Samphire Hoe.

Thanks go to Derek Smith who has compiled the report and all the contributors especially all the Volunteer Rangers, in particular Phil Smith, Tony Prentice, Roger Card and Les Collins, also to all the other observers including Ian Roberts and Geoff Burton.



SUMMARY OF 2014

January

140 Brent Geese flew east past the Hoe on the 1^{st} and 14 Rock Pipits were seen on the west beach, 64 Kittiwakes flew past on the 4^{th} and 100 Common Gulls flew west on the 7^{th} . A Sparrowhawk was seen on the 13^{th} and 7 Red Throated Divers observed just off the sea wall on the 18^{th} . Single Black Redstart throughout the month at the Eastern end of the Hoe plus 1-2 Peregrines. Two Ravens flew west on the 28^{th} .

February

Two Ravens on the 4th, 18 Brent Geese flew east on the 25th, Single Kestrel as with Black Redstart and Peregrine throughout the month, 4 Guillemots offshore on the 24th.

March

Two Black Redstarts on the 10th; the first Chiffchaff of the year was recorded on the 14th, also a single Reed Bunting. A Red Kite was reported over the Hoe on the 17th. First Wheatears of the year were noted on the 18th. Six Pintail flew west on the 18th and a Water Rail was seen to fall prey to a Peregrine. A Common Buzzard on the 23rd, a single Shag was noted on eight dates this month.

April

A Marsh Harrier observed coming in off the sea on the 1st, also 71 Sandwich Terns flew east that day. First Willow Warbler of the year was noted on the 6th. 140 Common Scoter flew east on the 17th, 15 Swallows flew in off the sea on the 19th. Three Yellow Wagtails and a Red Kite were logged on the 23rd, Single Common Sandpiper on the 24th. 17 Whimbrel flew east on the 25th, 3 Eider on the 27th and the first Ring Ouzel was recorded on the 29th.

May

85 Common Scoter and 14 Brents flew east on the 1st, 50 Bar Tailed Godwits, 3 Whimbrel and one Pomarine Skua all going east on the 3rd. First Hobby of the year on the 4th. Two Swifts flew over on the 6th. Two Spotted Flycatchers and a Sedge Warbler were recorded on the 13th. Two plus three juvenile Black Redstarts noted on the 21st and 2 Juvenile Stonechats on the 28th.

June

A pair of Black Redstarts plus 2 fledged young on the 3rd and 4th. A Shag on the 3rd, 2 Ravens on the 4th also a Kingfisher and Whinchat. A Hobby recorded on the 7th, a single Swift on the 9th, a Yellow Wagtail on the 22nd and a Chiffchaff on the 24th. A Honey Buzzard was seen flying out over the sea on the 28th.

July

200 House Martins on the 1st plus 4 Whitethroats, 1 adult + 2 juvenile Black Redstarts on the 2nd. One Little Egret on the 7th and a Eider on the 8th, 4 Swifts on the 12th. An early Red Throated Diver on the 13th and on the 14th a Grasshopper Warbler was located. First of the returning Wheatears was recorded on the 21st also a Hobby was seen on that day. A Grey Heron flew over on the 22nd and 12 Gannets were seen offshore. A Sedge Warbler recorded on the 30th.

August

Four Peregrines recorded on the 2nd and a Hobby on the 4th and 6th. 5 Black Redstarts seen on the 5th, a Sedge Warbler on the 6th. 6 Swifts flew over on the 11th. 10 Wheatears were on the Hoe on the 12th and 13th. A Buzzard drifted west on the 18th. Seven Whitethroats were recorded on the 19th and 22nd, 5 Willow Warblers noted on the 19th. 4 Little Egrets flew west on the 22nd, 10 Stonechats present on the 26th plus 4 Whinchats, a Reed Warbler on the 27th.

September

Five Willow Warblers recorded on the 1^{st} plus 2 Common Redstarts ,a Pied Flycatcher was present on the 1^{st} and 2^{nd} and 3 Lesser Whitethroats also six Black Redstarts on site and 1000 House Martins recorded. A Sand Martin flew over on the 6^{th} and a Buzzard flew west on the 7^{th} , 3 Ravens flew west on the 9^{th} . The first Siskins of the autumn were noted moving west on the 14^{th} . One Merlin recorded on the 16^{th} and 22^{nd} . 220 Med Gulls resting on the west beach on the 18^{th} . Six Whinchats on the 19^{th} , 5 Grey Wagtails and 15 Stonechats on the 20^{th} , a Ring Ouzel on the 21^{st} . 12 Chiffchaffs and a Jay on the 30^{th} .

October


A Hen Harrier flew west over the Hoe on the 1st as did two Jays, 6 Kestrels were also noted on that day. One Hobby on the 2nd and 10 Pied Wagtails moved through. Rare visitors to the Hoe were 3 Yellowhammers and a Great Spotted Woodpecker on the 3rd. 100+ Meadow Pipits were logged on the 7th. Two Arctic Skuas flew past on the 8th and a Great Skua on the 10th. 5 Black Redstarts on the 11th, 5 Chiffchaffs on the 14th and 5 Ring Ouzels on the 16th. 575 Brent Geese flew east on the 24th.

November

Fifty Goldfinches flew west on the 15th and a Buzzard noted on the same day. Three Black Redstarts recorded on the 17th, plus 2 Ravens along the cliff tops and a Eider was seen offshore. 15 Red Throated Divers flew east past the Hoe and 6 Stonechats were present on the site. Bird of the month was a Woodlark found on the 19th it was present for a short while the next day. Three Goosander flew past on the 17th, a Chiffchaff noted on the 19th, 4 Lapwings on the 20th, a Firecrest and a Snipe on the 21st. Twelve Rock Pipits on the west beach on the 30th.

December

One Shag and Two Black Redstarts recorded on the 1st, 16 Rock Pipits on the west beach on the 2nd. A Firecrest noted on the 3rd and 7th. 6 Fieldfares reported on the 5th. One Brambling on the 6th and a Snow Bunting on the 8th. 40 Meadow Pipits recorded on the Hoe on the 9th along with 6 Stonechats. Nine Dunnock logged on the 13th. A Chiffchaff recorded on the 16th plus 3 Little Egrets. One Water Rail noted on the 26th and 150 Gannets offshore on the 27th. A Marsh Harrier flew over the Hoe on the 30th.

Three flew past the Hoe on the 19^{th} of March, and the only other record was of one flying west on the 5^{th} of April

BRENT GEESE Branta bernicla

Common passage migrant

140 flew east on the 1st of January and 224 also going east on the 4th, then 60 on the 15th followed by 205 on the 28th. Three flew east on the 24th of February and 18 also going east on the 25th. Easterly movements recorded during March were 66 on the 10th, 40 on the 19th, 49 on the 20th and 250 on the 28th. During April 195 were recorded flying east on the 17th and 5 on the 27th. The last of the easterly movement was recorded on the 1st of May. First birds of the autumn were 15 flying east on the 21st of September 60 on the 22nd and 2 west on the 23rd. 575 past the Hoe on the 24th of October then 6 on the 28th. 50 flying west on the 18th of November, then 20 on the 30th. Just the two records for December and they were 5 on the 26th and 11 on the 30th.



Three moving east past the Hoe on the 27th of April, 1 on the 12th of May, 8th of July and the 17th of November.

COMMON SCOTER *Melanitta nigra*

Passage migrant

Spring migration was noted during April with counts of 27 going east on the 7^{th} of April , 140 on the 17^{th} , 49 on the 23^{rd} and 30 on the 27^{th} . Easterly movement noted during the first week of May with 85 on the 1^{st} and 110 on the 3^{rd} . First birds of the autumn were 2 on the 6^{th} and 27 on the 24^{th} of October. One flew west on the 7^{th} of December then 2 on the 26^{th} .

GOOSANDER *Mergus merganser*

Scarce passage migrant

Three flew past the Hoe on the 17th of November.

RED LEGGED PARTRIDGE Alectoris rufa

Scarce visitor

One seen on the 24th of April and again on the 3rd of May.

GREY PARTRIDGE Perdix perdix

Scarce visitor

One noted on the Hoe on the 6th of April.

RED THROATED DIVER Gavia stellata

Common winter visitor



Two on the 9^{th} of January and then 7 on the 18^{th} . No other records until March when a single was logged on the 8^{th} , 18^{th} and 28^{th} . An early record was of a single noted off the Hoe on the 13th of July. First birds of the winter were 5 flying east on the 18^{th} of November, 4 on the 19^{th} .

FULMAR Fulmarus glacialis

Resident breeder

Six on the 18th of January, 5 on the 19th and 9 on the 28th. Two on five dates in February, 3 on the 10th and 4 on the 26th. Six on the 1st and 10th of March Four on the 5th and 8th. Four on the 8th, and 5 on the 22nd of April. Up to four throughout May, No more than two recorded on any one date in June. Three on the 12th of July. Four on the 16th of August, 3 on the 25th and 7 on the 26th. 3-4 during the first week of September, One on the 15th was the last sighting until one was noted on the 23rd of November. Three on the 15th and 29th of December and 2 on the 23rd and 30th.

GANNET Morus bassanus

One flew west on the 9th of January, 4 offshore on the 14th. Singles on the 12th, 17th,18th, 22nd and 25th of March. Nine flew east on the 23rd of April, 31 on the 25th and 12 on the 27th. Two east on the 7th of May, One on the 16th of June, 12 on the 22nd and 5 on the 29th. Seven noted on the 19th of August. Singles on three dates in September. One on the 6th of October. Two flew east on the 16th of November, Twelve offshore on the 19th. 150 recorded offshore on the 27th of December

GREY HERON Ardea cinerea

Singles on the 6th, 8th and 20th of January, 1 on the 3rd and 18th of March. Two flew past the Hoe on the 1st of April. One flew east on the 4th of May and again on the 22nd of July. Two on the 27th of September. Single sightings on five dates in October, 2 on the 14th. Three past the Hoe on the 14th of November, then singles on two other dates during the month.

LITTLE GREBE Tachybaptus ruficollis

Scarce visitor

Just the one record this year and that was of a single bird seen on the 26th of May.

GREAT CRESTED GREBE Podiceps cristatus

Mainly a winter visitor

Few records this winter, Single on the 4th of January and on the 10th of February. Two offshore on the 28th of March, one on the 3rd of April. The next record was not until December when a single was noted offshore on the 13th.

HONEY BUZZARD Pernis apivorus

Rare passage migrant

One flew out to sea on the 28th of June.

RED KITE Milvus milvus

Rare passage migrant

One reported over the Hoe on the 17th of March. One flew east on the 23rd of April.

MARSH HARRIER Circus aeruginosus

Unusual passage migrant

One seen to fly in off the sea on the 1st of April. One over the Hoe on the 30th of December.

HEN HARRIER Circus cyaneus

Rare passage migrant

Ring tail observed flying west on the 15th of October.

SPARROW HAWK Accipiter nisus

Passage migrant/winter visitor

One recorded on the 13th of January, the 24th of February and again on the 12th of March. Single sightings on four dates during April. The next record was of a single bird on the 15th and 30th of August. One on eight dates throughout September. One seen to come in off the sea on the 5th of October. One recorded on the 9th of December.

COMMON BUZZARD Buteo buteo

Unusual visitor

One on the 23^{rd} of March, 1 on the 18^{th} of August. Three flew west on the 7^{th} of September then a single on the 16^{th} . The last record was of a single on the 9^{th} December.

COMMON KESTREL Falco tinnunculus

Resident breeder

1-2 throughout the first eight months of the year, there has been no proof of breeding on site this year. One flew out to sea on the 6th of September, possible movement on the 15th, 20th and 27th of September when eight were recorded on each day, 7 on the 30th. Six recorded on the 1st of October, 4 on the 5th and 14th then 1-3 during the rest of the month. Single on seven dates in November. Just the one record in December and that was on the 1st. One flew east over the Hoe on the 16th of September. One on the 22nd of September.

MERLIN Falco columbarius

Scarce winter visitor/passage migrant

One flew east on the 16th of September and 1 on the 22nd.

HOBBY Falco subbuteo

Summer visitor

One on the 4^{th} of May and the 7^{th} of June. One on the 21^{st} of July then again on the 23^{rd} , 27^{th} , 28^{th} and the 29^{th} . Single on the 4^{th} and 6^{th} of August. The last sighting of the autumn was of a single on the 2^{nd} of October.

PEREGRINE FALCON Falco peregrinus

Resident breeder

Two on the 5th, 14th and16th of January, Singles on four dates in February. 1-2 throughout March, April and May. Two noted at the east end of the Hoe and two at the west end on the 4th of June, the two seen at the west end were probably the pair reported to be holding territory in the area of Dead mans pool. Two plus two juveniles on the 25th of June, two adults and two juveniles on the on the 9th of July. Four on the 2nd of August and 3 on the 16th. 1-2 throughout September. Single on six dates during October and 1-2 throughout November and December.

WATER RAIL Rallus aguaticus

One seen to be taken by a Peregrine on the 18th of March. One on the Hoe on the 26th of December.

Thirteen flew up channel on the 19^{th} of April and 17 on the 25^{th} . Three flew east on the 3^{rd} of May.

One on the 22^{nd} of July and on the 17^{th} of November. During December singles were noted on the 1^{st} , 3^{rd} , 7^{th} , 15^{th} and 28^{th} , Two on the 8^{th} .

BAR TAILED GODWIT Limosa lapponica

Nine flew up channel on the 25th of April and then 50 on the 3rd of May.

COMMON SANDPIPER Actitis hypoleucos

First birds of the year were singles on the 24th and 26th of April, singles on the 11th and 19th of May. Six on the west beach on the 8th of July. Four noted on the 22nd and 3 on the 23rd. One on the 5th and 11th of August. The last bird of the autumn was a single on the 19th of September.

One on the seawall on the 27th of August.

Just the one record this year and that was of a single on the 13th of March.

One flew east on the 3rd of May.

Two flew past on the 8th of October, 1 on the 10th and 24th.

Four on the 17th of April. One on the 10th of October.

Singles on the 5th,9th, 13th and 15th of January, 2 on the 14th. Two on the 10th of February and 4 on the 24th. Last birds of the winter were singles on the 3rd and 18th of March. First bird of the winter was a single on the 18th and 19th of November.

Scarce passage migrant

The only record for the year was of 1 flying west on the 6th of September.

SWALLOW Hirundo rustica

Summer visitor

First bird of the year was of 1 on the 14th of April, 15 in off the sea on the 19th and 12 on the 25th. 28 recorded on the 13th of May 10 on the 18th. Highest count in June was of two. Two on the 14th of July. Five on the 4th of August, 6 on the 24th. 20 on the 2nd of September and again on the 21,st 16 on the 22nd. Twelve on the 4th of October, 30 on the 15th and the last bird of the year was a single on the 16th.

HOUSE MARTIN Delichon urbicum

Summer visitor/breeder



First birds of the year at Samphire Hoe were 2 on the 20th of April then again on the 21st, 5 on the 29th. Highest counts in May were 20 on the 13th, 50 on the 18th and 30 on the 27th, Highest count in June was 20 which occurred on four dates. 200 on the 1st of July, and 50 on four other dates. 100 on the 16th of August and 40 flew east on the 27th. 1000+ past the Hoe on the 2nd of September, 300 on the 6th and 100 on the 9th, Six were observed still feeding young on the 21st. The last recorded birds were 2 flying west on the 27th. *Approx 11 nest sites, down by half on the previous year*

CHIFFCHAFF Phylloscopus collybita Passage migrant

First bird of the spring was on the 14^{th} of March followed by 2 on the 17^{th} then singles on three other dates. Singles on four dates in April and 3 noted on the 9^{th} and 2 on the 14^{th} . Singles on two dates in May and one in June. Four on the 5^{th} of August. Birds were moving through in September with 12 on the 9^{th} , 21^{st} and 30^{th} and 42 on the 20^{th} . Four on the 1^{st} of October, 5 on the 14^{th} . One on the 19^{th} of November and the last bird of the year was on the 16^{th} of December.

WILLOW WARBLER Phylloscopus trochilus

Passage migrant

First bird of the year was on the 6th of April. The next sighting was of 2 on the 13th of May one of which was of the Northern race. First birds of the autumn were singles on the 14th and 18th of August and 5 on the 19th and 2 on the 24th and 28th. Five on the 1st of September, 6 on the 2nd and the last sighting of the year was of a single on the 22nd.

BLACKCAP Sylvia atricapilla

Passage migrant possible breeder

First of the year was of a single on the 3rd of April followed by 2 on the 8th then singles on three other dates. Single sightings on seven dates in June and on four dates in July. Two were noted on the 26th of August. Numbers increased a little in September but no double figures counts were recorded highest counts made were 6 on the 7th, 21st and 30th, 12 on the 19th, 7 on the 20th and 8 on the 23rd. Two on the 1st and 7th of October, 4 on the 12th and the last bird of the year was on the 16th.

LESSER WHITETHROAT Sylvia curruca

Summer visitor possible breeder

Two recorded on the 23^{rd} of April were the first birds of the year followed by one on the 29^{th} . Two on four dates in May and singles on five dates. One on the 18^{th} of August. Two on the 1^{st} of September, 3 on the 2^{nd} and One on the 6^{th} and 8^{th} were the last sightings of the year.

COMMON WHITETHROAT Sylvia communis

Summer visitor/breeder



First sightings of the year were 3 on the 22^{nd} and 23^{rd} of April followed by 2 on the 28^{th} then 4 on the 29^{th} . Four on the 3^{rd} of May and 5 on the 4^{th} then 1-3 throughout the rest of the

month. Two on six dates in June and 3 on four dates. Highest counts during July were 8 on the 8th and 5 on the 29th. Seven on the 19th and 22nd of August, and 8 on the 26th. Seven on the 8th of September, six on the 2nd and 9th. Two on the 29th proved to be the last of the autumn. *Breeding-5 territories held*.

GRASSHOPPER WARBLER Locustella naevia

Scarce passage migrant

One singing on the 14th of July this individual remained in the area for the best part of the day.

SEDGE WARBLER Acrocephalus schoenobaenus

Occasional passage migrant

First birds of the year were singles on the 13^{th} and 25^{th} of May. First of the returning birds was of a single on the 30^{th} of July, singles on three dates in August with 2 on the 27^{th} . One on the 2^{nd} and 19^{th} of September and the last bird of the autumn was noted on the 20^{th} .

REED WARBLER Acrocephalus scirpaceus

Scarce passage migrant

Singles on the 1st of June, 27th of August and the last bird of the year was seen on the 16th of September.

Starlings no longer breed at the Hoe. Not recorded during the first five months of the year the first record of the year was of 2 on the 9th and 23rd of June. Numbers increased in July with counts of 100 on the 18th, c200 on the 22nd, 27th and 28th and then c250 on the 29th. Highest counts during August were c200 on four dates, 250 on the 19th. Numbers dropped in September with counts of 100+ on the 27th and 50 on the 23rd and 30th. 50 were recorded on the 1st and 7th of October, 40 on the 4th and 30 on the 28th. One on the 18th of November and 2 on the 29th of December.

RING OUZEL Turdus torquatus

Passage migrant

Just the one record for the spring and that was of a single bird on the 29^{th} of April. First birds of the autumn migration through the Hoe were 1 on the 1^{st} of October followed by another on the 10^{th} two on the 13^{th} and 14^{th} , 3 on the 15^{th} . Last birds of the autumn were 5 on the 16^{th} .

Passage migrant winter visitor

First bird of the autumn was a single on the 21^{st} of November followed by one on the 28^{th} and 30^{th} . Two on the 3^{rd} of December followed by one on the 26^{th} and 28^{th} .

Scarce passage migrant

Two on the 13th of May.

One adult and two fledged young on the 3rd of June, a pair and two juveniles on the 4th, 4 on the 14th and 18th. During July juveniles were recorded on the 2nd and 9th six birds were logged on the 29th. Four on the 4th and 14th of August, 5 on the 11th,12th and 26th. During September numbers recorded are as follows 6 on the 2nd and 23rd, 5 on the 8th and 4 on 9th and 30th. Three on three dates in October, 5 noted on the 11th. 1-3 throughout November. Two on the 1st, 16th and 18th of December. *Breeding-One possible two breeding pairs*

First of the autumn movement was a single on the 21st of July then one on the 28th and 29th. During August 10 were logged on the 12th, 13th and 26th, 20 on the 19th and 8 on the 25th. Twelve recorded on the 1st and 2nd of September, 9 on the 27th plus 1-5 on fifteen other dates. Five on the 3rd, 14th and 18th of October. Last bird of the year was a single on the 28th of October.


