Samphire Hoe Bird Report for 2016





Samphire Hoe is owned by Eurotunnel and managed together with the White Cliffs Countryside Partnership.

The recording of the birds of Samphire Hoe provides information about the site's ecological development and its use as a migratory stopping point and a wintering ground.

The birds of Samphire Hoe are recorded on a casual basis by general observations. The breeding birds are monitored by an annual Common Bird Census, this plots out bird territories. The recording area is Samphire Hoe itself, the sea, the cliffs behind the Hoe and the east and west ends.

124 species were recorded during the year, 23 species held territory in the recording area. The bird report includes a monthly summary and then a systematic list of species seen in 2016. The information give under the species name is the bird's status at Samphire Hoe.

Thanks go to Derek Smith who has compiled the report and all the contributors, in particular all the volunteer Rangers, Phil Smith, Tony Prentice, Roger Card and Les Collins, also to all the other observers including Ian Roberts and Geoff Burton.

MONTHLY ASPECTS OF THE YEAR 2016

January

The year began on the Hoe with two unusual visitors in the form of two **Jays** on the 3rd, 6 **Little Gulls** were recorded off the Hoe on the 4th along with 14 **Rock Pipits** on the west beach. A small movement of 12 **Goldcrests** on the 6th. Five **Guillemots** offshore on the 10th, 8 **Fulmars** along the cliffs between the Hoe and Shakespeare Cliff on the 12th. 2 **Ravens** noted on the 15th and a **Shag** on the 18th followed by a **Razorbill** on the 19th. 3 **Common Scoter** flew west on the 20th.

February

100 **Common Gulls** flew west on the 2nd, a **Red Legged Partridge** noted on the Hoe also on the 2nd. A scarce sighting on the Hoe in the form of a **Purple Sandpiper** on the 9th. Five **Shag** noted offshore on the 14th. 9 **Long Tailed Tits** on the 16th plus one of the *Caudatus* race, 5 **Red Throated Divers** offshore on the 23rd. Two **Black Redstarts** noted at the Eastern end of the Hoe on the 26th. **Buzzards** recorded on three dates.

March

12 Rock Pipits on the 7th, 8 Black Tailed Godwits flew east on the 9th. The first Chiffchaff of the year was noted on the 10th, a Red Breasted Merganser flew past on the 11th. 200 Brents flew east on the 21st. 20+ Meadow Pipits recorded on the Hoe on the 22nd. A Water Rail noted on the 22nd. The first Wheatear of the year was recorded on the 24th and a Blackcap on the 30th. 2 Firecrests noted on the 31st also 3 Coal Tits of the continental race and 1 Brambling.

April

Firecrest on the 1st. 30 **Sandwich Terns** flew east on the 2^{nd.} **A Water Rail** noted on the 11th and a **Black Throated Diver** on the 10th. The 12th turned up the first **Ring Ouzel** of the spring; a **Yellow Wagtail** flew in off the sea and the first **Willow Warbler** of the year, a **Yellowhammer** was also recorded on that day. A **Red Kite** noted on the 14th. First **Common Whitethroat** of the year recorded along with **Swallows** and **House Martins**, a **Lesser Whitethroat** on the 24th. 9 **Manx Shearwaters** recorded on the 29th also 130 **Common Scoters** flew E. 2 **Ravens** + 2 young noted east of the Hoe also on the 29th.

May

Willow Warbler plus a **Coal Tit** on the 1st a pair of **Yellowhammers** also noted. On the 2nd birds recorded included **Brents** going east, 5 **Manx Shearwaters 2 Gadwall, 2**

Dunlin, 30 **Bar Tailed Godwits,** 50 **Sandwich Terns,** 70 **Commic Terns** all going east, 5 **Yellow Wagtails** seen to fly in off the sea. A **Grasshopper Warbler** recorded on the 3rd and a **Reed Warbler** on the 4th. A **Great Bustard** was seen coming in off the sea on the 4,th presumably a bird returning to the reintroduction scheme in Wiltshire, 3 **Black Throated** Divers flew east on the 5th. 5 **Whimbrel** on the 6th 12 **Common Scoter** flew east along with 3 **Pomarine Skuas.** Seven **Common Sandpipers** on the 10th and 2 **Swifts** on the 12th.

June

A **Wheatear** noted on the first, a **Little Egret** on the 3rd. On the 5th the **Little Grebes** were seen on the main pond an adult with 5 young, the first successful breeding recorded on the Hoe. One **Shag** was recorded on the 9th, 2 adult **Black Redstarts** with 3 juveniles noted on the 11th, **Peregrine** with one chick on the 15th. A family group of 5 **Whitethroats** recorded on the 16th. A **Chiffchaff** and a **Blackcap** seen on the 19th. A **Lapwing** flew over the site on the 26th.

July

Hobby observed over the Hoe on the 4th. A Juvenile **Common Redstart** was noted on the 14th, A **Honey Buzzard** flew over on the 18th and 15 **Swifts** on the 18th. Two **Sand Martins** flew west on the 21st. A **Common Gull** offshore on the 25th. 10 **Rock Pipits** recorded on the west beach on the 26th, also on the same day the first **Green Woodpecker** since April was in Woody Gully. 6 **Black Redstarts** noted on the 28th and 40 **Med Gulls** offshore. First of the returning **Willow Warblers** observed on the 31st plus a **Shag** offshore. A **Reed Warbler** was present throughout the month.

August

A Marsh Harrier flew over on the 1st, 13 Kittiwakes flew west on the 3rd plus 45 Common Terns. A Hobby noted on the 8th and a Sparrowhawk on the 10th plus three Sedge Warblers. The first Whinchat of the autumn was recorded on the 21st and a Wryneck was discovered on the 22nd. Six Yellow Wagtails flew over on the 24th. Seven Black Redstarts recorded on the 30th plus 8 Wheatears. 350 House Martins were feeding along the cliffs on the 29th.

September

A **Water Rail** was noted on the 2nd, 10 **Wheatears** recorded on the 6th, 30 **Gannets** offshore and the first **Brents** of the autumn on the 17th. A **Yellow Browed Warbler** was found in Gate Scrub on the 18th. A **Swift** flew over on the 19th and 2 House Sparrows were recorded. 50+ **Chiffchaffs** and 12 **Blackcaps** were recorded on the 20th, 24 **Rock Pipits** on west beach on the 24th, 12 **Stonechats** on the 30th.

October

27 **Chiffchaffs** noted on the 1st and 3 **Rooks** flew over the site. A **Firecrest** was seen on the 2nd. An **Arctic Skua** was observed offshore on the 9th. A **Yellow Browed Warbler** was recorded on the 10th also the first **Short Eared Owl** of the autumn was noted and 7 **Ring Ouzels**. A **Red Throated Diver** offshore on the 11th. 12 **Wigeon** flew east on the 28th and ten Med Gulls were seen offshore on the 29th plus 30 **Brents** flying west.

November

Two **Swallows** reported flying past the Hoe on the 1st, 2 **Chiffchaffs** noted also on the 1st. A **Woodcock** was put up on the 3rd. 85 **Auks** mainly **Guillemots** offshore. Six **Fieldfares** on the Hoe on the 3rd a **Redshank** also noted. Two **Ravens** on the 6th. A small fall of **Chaffinches** recorded on the 7th. A **Little Gull** offshore on the 8th and a **Black Redstart** seen on the same day. 19 **Red Throated Divers** flew past on the 13th, three **Little Egrets** noted on the 15th. An unexpected visitor, a **Long Eared Owl** was recorded by C.C.T V cameras resting on security fencing on the 18th. Two **Greenfinches** were seen on the 27th.

December

A **Cattle Egret** was observed in the field above the entrance to the Hoe, on the 3rd, only the second record since 2006. Another surprise was the very late **Wheatear** on the Hoe on the 4th. Four **Brambling** on the 7th. 9 **Wren** recorded on the 11th, 150 **Cormorants** flew E on the 20th, 200 **Great Black Backed Gulls** resting on the rocks to the west of the Hoe. 30 **Gannets** were noted offshore on the 24th and six **Guillemots** on the 25th, two **Shags** on the 27th.

WIGEON

Anas Penelope Passage bird Twelve flew east on 28th October.

PINTAIL

Anas acuta Passage bird One recorded on 10th April, one female on the main pond on 11th October.

COMMON SCOTER

Melanitta nigra Passage migrant Three flew west on 20th January. Easterly movement noted in April with 62 on the 2nd, 50 on the 10th and 130 on the 29th. Last of the spring migration were 12 going E on 6th May. First birds of the winter were 5 flying E on 23rd October, 12 on the 29th. Seven on 17th November.

RED BREASTED MERGANSER

Mergus Serrator Passage bird One flew past the Hoe on 11th March, three on 5th May.

RED LEGGED PARTRIDGE

Alecitoris rufa Occasional visitor

One on 2nd February, Single on three dates in March, two on the 14th. Two on 1st and 30th April, one on the 5th. One on 8th and 27th June, two on 18th July. Three recorded on 29th August and two on 9th September.

GREY PARTRIDGE

Perdix perdix One on 16th April and 2 on the 23rd. Singles on 30th May and 12th September.

PHEASANT

Phasianus colchicos Occasional visitor

One male seen on the cliff face on 9th February, single on four dates in March and on nine dates in April, 3 seen on the 15th. Single sightings on several dates in May, June and July, Male and one chick noted on 10th June. Two on three dates in September and October and singles on five other dates, two on 1st November and 11th December.

RED THROATED DIVER

Garvia stellate Winter visitor

One offshore on 16th February, 2 on the 22nd, 5 on the 23rd and 2 on the 24th. Three noted on the 8th of March, 2 on the 10th. 41 flew east on the 18th. First of the winter was of a single on 11th October. 19 flew past the Hoe on 13th November.

BLACK THROATED DIVER

Garvia arctica Winter visitor One offshore on 10th April and 3 flew east on 5th May.

FULMAR

Fulmarus glacialis Resident/Summer breeder

Four on 9th and 18th January, 8 on the 12th, three on 7th and 22nd February, four on the 9th. Eight on 8th March, 14 on 19th, 2-3 on other dates. Two at the west end of the Hoe 1st April, eight on the 14th and 19th, 6 on the 26th. on 1-4 on nine other dates during the month. Eight on 3rd May, four on the 2nd and 24th. 1-2 throughout June and 6 on the 21st. Four on 26th July. Four on 29th August. One on 4th, 5th and 13th September. First of the returning birds was seen on 5th December, three on the 14th and six on the 20th and 24th. One seen at the west end of the Hoe on the 26th.

MANX SHEARWATER

Puffinus puffinus Passage bird Nine flew past the Hoe on 29th April; one on 2nd May.

GANNET

Morus bassanus Winter visitor/passage migrant

Seven on 14th January, 8 on 3rd February and 25 offshore on the 14th. Seven on 7th and 10 on 19th March. 87 flew east on 2nd April, four on the 31st. 3 adults and 1 juvenile seen off the Hoe on 26th June. 14 flew west on 3rd August, four on the 7th. 30 seen offshore on 17th September, One on the 27th, 28th and 30th. 15 offshore on 29th October and 20 on the 30th. 10 recorded on 13th November. 30 offshore on 24th December and 10 on the 25th.

CORMORANT

SHAG

Phalacrocorax aristotelis Winter visitor

Five were recorded on 14^{th} February and three on the 16^{th} . Single noted on four dates in March and two on three other dates. One recorded on 1^{st} , 4^{th} , 10^{th} and 12^{th} April. One on 10^{th} , 17^{th} and 25^{th} May. One on 9^{th} June and 31^{st} July. Single on 4^{th} and 13^{th} September, two on the 21^{st} . Four noted on 11^{th} October, one on the 19^{th} . Single on 26^{th} November plus two on the 27^{th} . Two on 7^{th} and 27^{th} December.

CATTLE EGRET

Bubulous ibis

One recorded amongst the cattle in the field above the entrance to Samphire Hoe on 3^{rd} December. Only the second record from the local area.



LITTLE EGRET

Egretta garzetta Occasional visitor to the Hoe

Two on 2nd and 4th January, three on the 5th, singles on six other dates. One seen walking around back car park on the 7th (*but did not purchase car park ticket*). Singles on five dates in February and three in March. Just the single sighting in April. Single sightings in May, June, August and September. Three noted on 4th October, four on the 24th and two on the 21st, 30th and 31st. Single on eight dates in November, three on the 15th. Two records in December with singles noted on the 11th and 19th.

GREY HERON

Ardea cinerea

Passage bird

One flew past on 2nd, 6th and 12th January. Three recorded on 2nd February. One on 11th March. Two flew E on the 28th of June. One going E on 5th and 6th July and again on the 17th and 18th. Two flew past on the 25th. Singles recorded four times in August and on seven dates in September, five noted on the 19th. Single sightings on five dates in October, two on the 4th and 25th. One on a few dates in November and December.

LITTLE GREBE

Tachybaptis ruficallis Normally a non-resident

First sighting was of one on 10th March. Not recorded again until a pair were seen on 3rd May after that there were six single sightings during the rest of the month. Two adults and two young were present on the main pond on 8th June this turned out to be the first successful breeding attempt, the following day he two adults were seen with five chicks, One adult and three chicks were noted on the 22nd. 1-3 recorded throughout July, four on the 25th. Two were recorded on eight dates in August and one on six dates. Three noted on 5th September and two on the 6th, several single sightings up and till the end of the month then nothing.



GREAT CRESTED GREBE

Podiceps cristatus

Mainly a winter visitor

One offshore on 4th and 10th January. Two on the 23rd, 25th and 29th February. Twelve offshore on 7th March, five on the 20th and 10 on the 22nd. Last of the winter was of a single on 1st April.

HONEY BUZZARD

Pernis apivrus Rare passage migrant



One observed coming in off the sea on 18th July.

RED KITE

Milvus milvus Rare passage migrant One noted on 14th April.

MARSH HARRIER

Circus aeruginosus Passage migrant One seen to fly over the Hoe on 1st August.

SPARROWHAWK

Accipter nisus Not a resident frequent visitor

One on 15th February, 29th March and again on 12th and 16th April. Sightings continued to be of single observations throughout May, August and September. Single sightings on six dates throughout October. One on 6th November and again on 5th and 26th December.

COMMON BUZZARD

Buteo buteo

Mainly a passage migrant

Single on 15th, 24th and 29th February, two on 3rd March, two flew E on the 20th, three flew west on the 23rd and six on the 31st. One on 5th April, 8th, 10th and 14th. Four recorded on the 12th and two on the 17th and 18th. Single on five dates in May, four dates in July. Two noted on 15th September plus singles on two dates. One on 17th and 30th October. Three recorded on 6th November.

KESTREL

Falco tinnunculus Resident

1-2 Recorded on many dates throughout the first six months of the year, ten single sightings recorded in July. 1-2 throughout August, four on 9th September and three on the 25th. Three on 17th and 18th October. The last two months of the year saw twenty one single sightings.

HOBBY

Falco subbuteo

Summer visitor

First bird of the year was of a single on 4th July, the next sightings was again of a single on 8th and 10th August. Disappointing year for this species seeing that dragonflies were plentiful around the main pond.

PEREGRINE FALCON

Falco peregrinus Resident

1-2 recorded from the east end of the Hoe throughout the first four months of the year, one noted at the western end of the Hoe on 1st May, two on the 19th. Two plus one chick recorded on 15th June at the east end of the Hoe and a juvenile noted at the west end. Single on six dates in July and on ten dates in August, two on 5th and 27th August plus three on the 13th. During the last three months of the year there were sixteen days of single sightings and two on 4th November and two on 11th December.

WATER RAIL

Rallus aquatious

Rare visitor

Single on 23rd March, One on 10th, 11th and 16th April. The last record for the year was of one on 2nd September.

MOORHEN

Gallinula chloropus Resident and winter visitor

Nest discovered on 11th April. Two adults and four young noted on 1st May, One adult and four juveniles on the 23rd. One adult and three juveniles on 11th June. The odd chick or two recorded on several dates in July.

OYSTERCATCHER

Haematopus ostralegus Passage bird One flew past the Hoe on 19th February. Single flying E on 24th and 30th April. Seven going E past the Hoe on 5th May. Two flew west on 19th July and four on the 26th.

GREY PLOVER

Pluvialis squatarola Passage bird Three flew E on 5th May, then three on the 23rd.

LAPWING

Vanellus vanellus Passage bird One present on the Hoe on 24th June. Two seen on the seawall on 6th July. One recorded on 11th and 26th November.

WHIMBREL

Numenius phaeopus Passage migrant First of the spring migration was of a single bird flying E on 13th April, Further E movements were of nine on the 27th and three on the 29th. One E on 2nd May, five on the 4th and one on the 6th. The only other records were of one flying NE on 14th July and on the 25th.

CURLEW

Numenius arquata Passage bird 18 flew E on13th March, two on the 20th. One recorded flying E on 21st April.

BAR TAILED GODWIT

Limosa lapponica Passage migrant One flew E on 21st April. 30 recorded flying E on 2nd May.

Black Tailed Godwit

Limosa limosa Passage migrant Eight seen flying E on 9th March.

DUNLIN

Calidris alpine Passage migrant Two flew east past the Hoe on 2nd May. One on the west beach on 22nd and 23rd September.

COMMON SANDPIPER

Actitus hypoleucos

Passage migrant

First passage bird of the year was a single on 26^{th} April, seven on the west beach on 10^{th} May. First of the returning birds were 2 recorded on 1^{st} August, two on the 24^{th} . Two noted on 12^{th} September and the last bird of the year was a single sighting on the 23^{rd} .

PURPLE SANDPIPER

Calidri maritime Winter visitor

One on 9th February, an unusual visitor to the Hoe, one would have thought there would have been more records from the site seeing that they are recorded to the east of the site and a bit further to the west.

REDSHANK

Tringa tetanus Passage bird One on 20th and 21st August, the only other record was of one flying east on 3rd November.

WOODCOCK

Scolopax rusticola Scarce winter visitor One on 3rd and 10th November.

COMMON SNIPE

Gallinago gallinago Passage bird One on 24th March and another on 30th November.

POMARINE SKUA

Stercorarius pomarinus Passage migrant Three flew east past the Hoe on 6th May.

ARCTIC SKUA

Stercorarius parasiticus Passage migrant First sightings of the year were of singles on 2nd, 5th and 8th May, last bird of the year was the one seen on 7th October.

GREAT SKUA

Stercorarius skua Passage migrant One flew east on 2nd April, two on the 10th and one on the 29th.

RAZORBILL

Alca torda Winter visitor

A very quiet winter of the Hoe for this species with just the single sighting on 19^{th} January and on 3^{rd} February. First birds of the autumn were five just offshore on 4^{th} November.

GUILLEMOT

Uria aalge Mainly a winter visitor

As for the previous species it was a quite winter for sightings. A single recorded on 4th and 12th January, five offshore on the 10th. One on 4th and 16th February and then on 6th March. First bird of the autumn was of a single on 1st October, two on the 24th. 85 recorded offshore on 4th November and then one on the 8th and 13th. Single on four dates in December and 6 on the 25th plus two on the 26th.

SANDWICH TERN

Sterna sandvicensis

Passage migrant

First birds of the year were 30 flying east on 2nd April, two on the 14th and six on the 21st, 45 on the 29th. 50 flew east on 2nd May then four on the 6th. Two seen flying west on 12th July, two offshore on the 28th. Very poor autumn migration recorded just the single on 9th October. One recorded on 4th December off the Hoe.

COMMON TERN

Sterna hirundo Passage migrant One on 2nd and 14th April. 5 east on 10th May. 45 flew west on 3rd August.

COMMIC TERN

102 flew east on 13th April, 70 also flying east on 2nd May.

Ten seen offshore on 4th January, five on the 12th and two on the 10th and 18th. 100+ flying west on 2nd February. 1-5 noted during the rest of the month. Two on 21st March, one on 4th April, 25th May and 18th of August. One on 24th October and two on the 29th. Three on 15th November and four on the 17th. Singles on three dates in December plus two on the 27th.

COLLARED DOVE

Streptopelia decaocto Scarce visitor Just the one record this year and that was of one on 26th April.

CUCKOO

Cuculus canorus Scarce migrant One on 7th June was the only record for the year.

LONG EARED OWL

Asio otus Rare visitor One captured by security cameras in the early hours of the morning resting on the compound fencing this was on 11th November.

SHORT EARED OWL

Asio flammeus Mainly a winter visitor One seen to come in off the sea on 30th March. One remained on the Hoe from 24th to 27th April. One on 10th October.

GREAT BUSTARD

Otis tarda Very rare vagrant

One seen to come in off the sea on 4th May, a totally unexpected sighting, presumably returning to the re-introduction scheme in Wiltshire the first ever record for Samphire Hoe.

SWIFT

Apus apus

Summer migrant





One recorded just off the west end of the Hoe on 31st March, but not noted again until two were seen on 16th April then six on the 26th. 20 on May the 1st, 6th and 25th, 30 on the 17th and 24th and c40 on the 31st. 50 on the 4th June, 5th and 19th July. Numbers increased in August with 100 on the 16th and 350 on the 29th. 350 on 15th September, 200 on the 17th and c500 on the 18th and the 19th plus 300 on the 20th. Thirty noted on the 10th of October, 12 on the 11th then 40 seen flying east on the 12th were the last of the year.
