# SAMPHIRE HOE BIRD REPORT FOR 2017





Samphire Hoe is owned by Eurotunnel and managed together with the White Cliffs Countryside Partnership.

The recording of the birds of Samphire Hoe provides information about the site's ecological development and its use as a migratory stopping point and a wintering ground.

The birds of Samphire Hoe are recorded on a casual basis by general observations. The breeding birds are monitored by an annual Common Bird Census, this plots out bird territories. The recording area is Samphire Hoe itself, the sea, the cliffs behind the Hoe and the east and west ends.

123 species were recorded in 2017 in the recording area, an equivalent number to that of 2016. 23 different species held territory in the recording area. The bird report includes a monthly summary and then a systematic list of species seen in 2017. The information give under the species name is the bird's status at Samphire Hoe.

# ASPECTS OF THE YEAR 2017

#### JANUARY

The month began with unusual numbers of Cormorants moving East up the Channel with counts of 310 on the 6<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>, 910 noted on the 30<sup>th</sup>. 10 Gannets offshore on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3 Red Throated Divers on the 7<sup>th</sup>, 200 Brents flew East on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 910 on the 30<sup>th</sup>. Six Fulmars were recorded on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>. A three way punch up was observed between a Peregrine/ Raven and a Buzzard on the 30<sup>th</sup>. 4 Shags and 2 Razorbills logged on the 30<sup>th</sup>. Little Egrets seen on five dates throughout the month.

#### **FEBRUARY**

The first Black Redstart for 2017 was recorded on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 64 Red Throated Divers flew East on the 6<sup>th</sup>. A single Shelduck noted flying West on the 7<sup>th</sup>. 40 Guillemots noted someway offshore on the 8<sup>th</sup> plus 38 Kittiwakes feeding just off the seawall. Numbers of Cormorants remained high this month with 1,290 passing the Hoe on the 6<sup>th</sup>, c.1,000 on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 1,172 on the 14<sup>th</sup>. The first Little Grebe of the winter was recorded on the 14<sup>th</sup>, then 2 on the 19<sup>th</sup>. A Buzzard was noted on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> and a c.120 Gannets offshore on the 21<sup>st</sup>, 150 Brents flew East on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 27 Common Gull flew West on the 28<sup>th</sup>. A Shag recorded on four dates throughout the month.

#### MARCH

A Red Kite reported on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1 flew West on the 6<sup>th</sup>. 11 Rock Pipits including 1 of the race *Littoralis* were seen on the 4<sup>th</sup>. A Woodlark flew in off the sea on the same day. On the 10<sup>th</sup> a Stonechat of the race *Rubicola* was reported. 38 Red Throated Divers were seen flying East, 10 Common Gulls flying West. The first Blackcap of the spring was noted on the 12<sup>th</sup>. 2 Reed Buntings were recorded on the 15<sup>th</sup> followed two days later by the first Wheatear of the year, 800 Brents flew East on the 18<sup>th</sup>. The first Chiffchaff of the spring was logged on the 20<sup>th</sup>. 6 Fulmar noted on the 28<sup>th</sup> plus 1 EIDER just offshore. A Common Snipe was recorded on the 30<sup>th</sup> plus a Yellowhammer.

# APRIL

Four Mute Swans flew E on the 4<sup>th</sup>, 98 Sandwich Terns moved East on the 8<sup>th</sup>. The first Common Whitethroat was recorded on the 9<sup>th</sup> followed by 2 Willow Warblers on the 10<sup>th</sup> and 3 Swallows. A Ring Ouzel was noted on the 9<sup>th</sup>. A Raven was recorded feeding 2 young on the 13<sup>th</sup>. The first 2 House Martins of the year on the Hoe arrived on the 17<sup>th</sup> and a Velvet Scoter was seen going East. One Lesser Whitethroat recorded on the 18<sup>th</sup> was the first of the spring migrants, 9 Bar Tailed Godwits flew E. The following day the 19<sup>th</sup> 5 Grey Plover and 44 Whimbrel flew up channel. A Great Skua seen offshore on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. A Common Redstart a rare bird for the Hoe was noted on the 29<sup>th</sup>. A Pomarine Skua seen flying East on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

#### MAY

The month began with 5 Pomarine Skuas flying East on the 1<sup>st</sup>, the following day a single Surf Scoter was seen offshore the same day 3 Yellow Wagtails were observed coming in off the sea. 16 Whimbrel flew East on the 4<sup>th</sup> and 11 Stonechats were recorded on the Hoe. A single Arctic Skua flew East on the 7<sup>th</sup> plus 683 Commic Terns also on that day 16 Bar Tailed Godwits flew East and 3 Shags were seen offshore and 6 Swifts were seen. 3 Little Egrets flew East on the 10<sup>th</sup> and the Little Grebe and 3 chicks were observed on the main pond. On the 12<sup>th</sup> a Spotted Flycatcher and a Sedge Warbler were recorded. Two Ravens and 3 fledged young were seen at the nest site on the 14<sup>th</sup>. An uncommon visitor to the Hoe on the 18<sup>th</sup> was a single Collared Dove, 5 Common Whitethroats on the 29<sup>th</sup>.

# JUNE

A Med Gull was recorded off shore on the 5<sup>th</sup>, 8 Swifts flew over on the 12<sup>th</sup> and a Common Gull was seen offshore. Single Raven logged on the 13<sup>th</sup> c.150 Common Scoter flew up the Channel on the 14<sup>th</sup>. The first Wheatear of the autumn was noted on the 18<sup>th</sup>, A juvenile Black Redstart was noted at the East end of the Hoe on the 20<sup>th</sup> plus a Rock Pipit was seen to be feeding young. Single Lesser Whitethroats seen on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, two Stock Doves on the cliff face on the 26<sup>th</sup> and 2 Kestrel chicks seen at the cliff face nest site.

# JULY

A House Sparrow recorded on the 4<sup>th</sup> is deemed as a bit of a rarity for the Hoe. One Whimbrel flew West on the 6<sup>th</sup>. A Black Redstart and 3 juveniles recorded from the East end of the Hoe on the 9<sup>th</sup>, 65 Common Scoter flew East on the 10<sup>th</sup> and 3 Yellow Wagtails flew over the Hoe on the 11<sup>th</sup>. A Honey Buzzard was seen to fly over on the 19<sup>th</sup>. 4 Ravens noted on the 21<sup>st</sup> and 12 Swifts on the 25<sup>th</sup>. A juvenile Cuckoo remained on the Hoe between the 24<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>. The first Hobby of the year was noted on the 25<sup>th</sup>, two Willow Warblers recorded on the 26<sup>th</sup>. C.50 Starlings on the Hoe on the 31<sup>st</sup> plus 12 Stonechats.

# AUGUST

8 Med Gulls flew West on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 70 Swifts were observed moving West on the 7<sup>th</sup>. A c.20 Stonechats was noted on the 8<sup>th</sup> along with 28 Linnets, 10 Common Whitethroats and 150 Starlings. A Single Whinchat on the 14<sup>th</sup> was the first of the autumn, 6 Wheatear on the 20<sup>th</sup> plus 3 Black Redstarts. A Reed Warbler remained on the Hoe for four days and a juvenile Shelduck for one week.

# SEPTEMBER

A juvenile Sparrowhawk was recorded on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and a Grasshopper Warbler on the 4<sup>th</sup>. A Spotted Flycatcher was noted on the 15<sup>th</sup>, A Yellow Wagtail flew over the Hoe on the 16<sup>th</sup> as did a single Swift. A movement of Blackcaps through the Hoe was recorded on the 19<sup>th</sup> when 50 were noted. 3 Goldcrests logged on the 20<sup>th</sup> and a single Ring Ouzel on the 25<sup>th</sup> also a Buzzard was recorded on that day. A Kingfisher was recorded on the 27<sup>th</sup> plus a Common Redstart.

# OCTOBER

40 Chiffchaffs noted on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 20 Sand Martins flew West on the 5<sup>th</sup>, a single Whimbrel recorded on the same day. 11 Stonechats logged on the 12<sup>th</sup> and 3 House Sparrows on the 14<sup>th</sup>. A Short Toed Treecreeper was mist netted and then ringed on the 15<sup>th</sup>. 250 Med Gulls recorded offshore on the 18<sup>th</sup> plus 2 Arctic Skuas. Four Raven noted on the 18<sup>th</sup>, a single Ring Ouzel on the 19<sup>th</sup> A Short Eared Owl was flushed from the bank close to the security compound on the 24<sup>th</sup>. 5 Long Tailed Tits seen on the 28<sup>th</sup> and to round off a good month a Yellow Browed Warbler was recorded on the 31<sup>st</sup>.

# NOVEMBER

The month began with the discovery of another Yellow Browed Warbler of the autumn. 170 Med Gulls offshore on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. A single Blackcap on the 3<sup>rd</sup> along with a Coal Tit and on the same day 4 Lapwings flew over the Hoe. A Woodcock was recorded on the 11<sup>th</sup>. Three Little Egrets were on the West pond on the 13<sup>th</sup> and a Red Necked Grebe was recorded offshore on the 15<sup>th</sup> and a Arctic Skua on the 19<sup>th</sup>. 25 Siskin were seen to fly in off the sea on the 25<sup>th</sup>.

# DECEMBER

2 Ravens noted on the Hoe in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>, 10 Stonechats recorded on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and a Shag seen offshore on the 5<sup>th</sup>, 50+ Great Backed Gulls flew past on the 12<sup>th</sup>. A Black throated Diver noted offshore on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 4 Red Throated Divers on the 14<sup>th</sup>. On the Hoe 20 Meadow Pipits were observed on the 18<sup>th</sup> and 32 Jackdaws on the 19<sup>th</sup>, 75 Cormorants flew West on the 26<sup>th</sup>. 12 Rock Pipits noted at the Western end of the Hoe and 2 Black Redstarts at the Eastern end, 2 possible Slavonian Grebes reported, all on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

First birds of the autumn were 2 on the 25<sup>th</sup> of September, the next sighting was of 4 flying West on the 15<sup>th</sup> of October a further 4 on the 18<sup>th</sup>. 36 were noted flying West on the 24<sup>th</sup> and 7 on the 29<sup>th</sup>. 30 flew past the Hoe on the 5<sup>th</sup> of November, 48 on the 13<sup>th</sup> and then 30 going E n the 19<sup>th</sup>. Three flew East on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of December.

10 Chicks on the main pond on the 13 of May, 4 adults and 11 chicks on the 16<sup>th</sup>. Female and 12 chicks on the 4<sup>th</sup> of June, female and 7 young on the 27<sup>th</sup>. Probably three broods reared but the chicks were heavily predated.

c.150 flying East on the 14<sup>th</sup> of June, 40 observed flying West on the 28<sup>th</sup>. 65 flew West on the 10<sup>th</sup> of July, 2 West on the 26<sup>th</sup>. First bird of the autumn was one on the 28<sup>th</sup> of November.

VELVET SCOTER *Melanitta fusca Passage bird* One going East on the 17<sup>th</sup> of April.

RED LEGGED PARTRIDGE *Alectoris rufa Occasional visitor* One seen on the Hoe on the 31<sup>st</sup> of April.

#### PHEASANT

Phasianus colchicus

Occasional visitor

One on the 16<sup>th</sup> of February. 2 on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> of March. 2 on the 4<sup>th</sup> of April then a single on six other dates. A break of four months before the next sighting which was of a hen bird on the 11<sup>th</sup> of September then again on the 17<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>. 1-2 throughout October. A cock bird noted on the 8<sup>th</sup> of December.

## RED THROATED DIVER

Gavia stellate

Winter visitor

3 recorded off the Hoe on January the 7<sup>th</sup> then 1 on the 25<sup>th</sup>. 54 flew East on the 6<sup>th</sup> of February then 5 on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 17 on the 14<sup>th</sup>. Just 3 records for March: 2 birds going East on the 7<sup>th</sup>, 38 on the 11<sup>th</sup> and 3 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. First birds of the winter were singles on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> of December.

BLACK THROATED DIVER Garvia arctica Winter visitor One recorded offshore on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of December

# GREAT NORTHERN DIVER

*Garvia immer* One reported on the 14<sup>th</sup> of December.

#### FULMAR

6 recorded on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> of January then 7 on the 30<sup>th</sup>. During February, 9 were noted on the 8<sup>th</sup>, 5 on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 8 on the 24<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>. 3-6 recorded on eleven dates in March and 2-4 throughout April 7 on the 11<sup>th</sup>. 2 on three dates in May, 3 on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 5 on the 16<sup>th</sup>. 2 on three dates in June and two dates in July. Single sightings on six dates in August, 3 on the 8<sup>th</sup>. Last birds of the summer were 1 on the 4<sup>th</sup> of September and 2 on the 8<sup>th</sup>. First of the returning birds were 1 on the 20<sup>th</sup> of November and 2 on the 28<sup>th</sup>. 5 were noted on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of December, 1 on four dates and 2 on the 21<sup>st</sup>.

#### GANNET

#### Winter visitor/ Passage migrant

10 offshore on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of January, 8 on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>. C.120 noted offshore on the 21<sup>st</sup> of February, ten on the 5<sup>th</sup> of March. 56 flew East past the Hoe on the 19<sup>th</sup> of April. 8 recorded on the 13<sup>th</sup> of May. 3-7 offshore on seven dates in July plus 38 on the 26<sup>th</sup>. 30 offshore on the 5<sup>th</sup> of August. 40 noted on the 8<sup>th</sup> of September. During the month of October, numbers recorded were 60 on the 1<sup>st</sup>, 100 on the 16<sup>th</sup> and 75 on the 18<sup>th</sup>. On the 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> of November counts of 200 were made. 40 offshore on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of December and 50+ on the 28<sup>th</sup>.

In the early months of the year large numbers of Cormorants were recorded moving up and down the channel, numbers recorded were 1,590 going East on the 6<sup>th</sup> of January, c.330 on the 10<sup>th</sup>, 70 in a feeding frenzy off the Hoe on the 25<sup>th</sup>, 300 flying E on the 29<sup>th</sup>, 910 on the 30<sup>th</sup>. c.600 flew West on the 1<sup>st</sup> of February, 400 East on the 6<sup>th</sup>, c.1,000 on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 1,172 on the 14<sup>th</sup>. 30 flew East on the 19<sup>th</sup> of March. 45 going East on the 29<sup>th</sup> of November. 75 flew West on the 26<sup>th</sup> of December.

# SHAG *Phalacrcorax aristotelis Winter visitor*

4 noted on the  $30^{th}$  of January. Single sightings on the  $6^{th}$ ,  $7^{th}$ ,  $8^{th}$  and  $15^{th}$  of February. One on the  $7^{th}$ ,  $27^{th}$  and  $28^{th}$  of March. 4 on the  $20^{th}$  of April, 3 on the  $7^{th}$  of May. Single sighting on the  $13^{th}$  of August. One on the  $4^{th}$  of September then 2 on the  $4^{th}$  and  $5^{th}$ . One on the  $10^{th}$  and 26th of October, 2 on the  $31^{st}$ . Single sighting on the  $19^{th}$  of November. 2 on the  $5^{th}$  of December, singles on the  $21^{st}$  and  $28^{th}$ .

Single sightings on five dates in January and on four dates in February. One on the 10<sup>th</sup> of March. 3 flew West on the 16<sup>th</sup> of April and 2 flew East on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. One on the 8<sup>th</sup> of May and 3 flew East on the 10<sup>th</sup>. 3 recorded on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of July. 2 flew west past the Hoe on the 8<sup>th</sup> of August single birds recorded on the 13<sup>th</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>. One on the 24<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> of September. Single sightings on seven dates in October. 2 flew East on the 14<sup>th</sup> and 2 West on the 17<sup>th</sup>. One recorded on 6 dates in November 3 on the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>. Singles on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 15<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> of December.

#### GREY HERON

#### Ardea cinerea

#### Passage bird

One on the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> of January, 2 flew East on the 5<sup>th</sup> of February and 1 West on the 14<sup>th</sup>. Two flew West on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of April. One noted on the 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> of May and again on the 14<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> of July single sighting on six dates in August, 3 on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 4 on the 29<sup>th</sup>. Single on five dates in September, 14 West on the 24<sup>th</sup> 2 on the 26<sup>th</sup>. 2 on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> of October, 1 on the 19<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>. 2 on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> of November. 2 on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> of December.

#### LITTLE GREBE

#### Tachybaptus ruficollis

One reported on the main pond on the 4<sup>th</sup> of February from then on 5 single sightings were recorded then 2 on the 19<sup>th</sup>, 21<sup>st</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>. 1-2 throughout March and April. Pair throughout May, 2 on the 10<sup>th</sup> plus 3 chicks. 1 juvenile on the 31<sup>st</sup>. One plus 2 juveniles on the 5<sup>th</sup> of June, recorded throughout the month. Not recorded during the rest of the year probably because of falling water levels in the main pond.

#### GREAT CRESTED GREBE

*Podiceps cristatus Mainly a winter visitor* 

98 offshore on the 25<sup>th</sup> of January then 6 on the 21<sup>st</sup> of February. 1 on the 7<sup>th</sup> of March. One offshore on the 7<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> of May. First birds of the winter were single sightings on the 12<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> of November. 6 off the Hoe on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of December and 2 on the 14<sup>th</sup>.

#### RED NECKED GREBE

*Podiceps grisegena Passage bird* One recorded off the Hoe on the 13<sup>th</sup> of November.

#### SLAVONIAN GREBE

Podiceps auritusPassage bird2 reported off the Hoe on the 28<sup>th</sup> of December.

#### HONEY BUZZARD

*Pernis apivorus Passage migrant* One flew West on the 9<sup>th</sup> of July.

#### RED KITE

*Milvus milvus Passage bird* One reported on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of March, 1 flew West on the 6<sup>th</sup> then another on the 4<sup>th</sup> of April.

#### SPARROWHAWK

#### Accipiter nisus

Single sightings on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of January then again on the 28<sup>th</sup> of April. Not recorded again until August when 1 was recorded on three dates. One juvenile was noted on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of September and a male on the 16<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>. One on the 17<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> of October and also on the 6<sup>th</sup> of November and the 12<sup>th</sup> of December.

#### BUZZARD

## Mainly a passage bird

2 recorded on the 10<sup>th</sup> of January, 1 observed having a tussle with a Raven on the 21<sup>st</sup>, 1 noted on the 15<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> of February. Single on the 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> of March and the 29<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> of April. 1 on the 25<sup>th</sup> of September and the 29<sup>th</sup> of October.

One on eight dates in January, 2 on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. Single on five dates in February and eleven dates in March. 1-2 throughout April/May. Pair present throughout June. 2 chicks at cliff face nest site on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. Pair present throughout July, 3 juveniles noted on the 10<sup>th</sup>. 2 on the 6<sup>th</sup> of August and single sightings on eight dates. 1-3 during September, 4 on the 10<sup>th</sup> and 7 on the 30<sup>th</sup>. 5 recorded on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> of October. 1-2 throughout November and single sightings in December.

HOBBY Falco columbarius Summer visitor One over the Hoe on the 25<sup>th</sup> of July, scarce this summer.

# Falco peregrinus Resident

Single sightings on four dates in January, pair on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. Recorded throughout May with a peak total of 6 on the  $7^{\text{th}}$ . One on five dates in June. One ringed bird was noted on the  $26^{\text{th}}$  of July and was found to have been ringed on Skokholm (island off the South West coast of Wales). 4 on the  $10^{\text{th}}$  and  $14^{\text{th}}$  of August, 5 on the  $7^{\text{th}}$  and 6 on the  $20^{\text{th}}$  and  $29^{\text{th}}$ . Numbers increased in September with 10 on the  $4^{\text{th}}$ , 12 on the  $5^{\text{th}}$ , 9 on the  $6^{\text{th}}$  and 8 on the  $12^{\text{th}}$ . 1-2 recorded on the Hoe up until the  $23^{\text{rd}}$  of October.






*Carduelis carduelis Mainly a passage bird*

Single sightings on three dates in March, 4 on the 7<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>. 2 on the 3rd and 11<sup>th</sup> of April and 3 on the 4<sup>th</sup>. 4 on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of May. One on the 4<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> of June and 2 on the 16<sup>th</sup> of July. Numbers started to increase in August with birds moving through, 12 on the 8<sup>th</sup>, 15 on the 11<sup>th</sup>. A further increase in September with 40 recorded on the 10<sup>th</sup>, 20 on the 24th and 18 on the 30<sup>th</sup>. A few birds still moving through in October with 30 on the 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>, 35 on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 34 on the 12<sup>th</sup>. 10 on the 29<sup>th</sup>. 11 on the 13<sup>th</sup> of November and 1-2 on seven other dates. 4 on December the 9<sup>th</sup>. One possible breeding pair.
