SAMPHIRE HOE BIRD REPORT FOR 2018









Samphire Hoe is owned by Eurotunnel and managed together with the White Cliffs Countryside Partnership.

The recording of the birds of Samphire Hoe provides information about the site's ecological development, its use as a migratory stopping point and a wintering ground.

The birds of Samphire Hoe are recorded on a casual basis by general observations. The breeding birds are monitored by an annual Common Bird Census, this maps the bird territories. The recording area is the Hoe itself, the sea, the cliffs behind the Hoe and the east and west ends.

143 species were recorded during the year 2018, of which 23 species held territory in the recording area. The bird report includes a monthly summary and then a systematic list of species seen in 2018. The information given under the species name is the bird's status at Samphire Hoe.

Thanks go to Derek Smith who has compiled the report and all the contributors especially all the Volunteer Rangers, in particular Phil Smith, Steve Cutt, Les Collins, Martin Collins, Richard Coote and also to all the other observers including lan Roberts and Geoff Burton.

SUMMARY OF 2018

JANUARY

22 Rock Pipits were recorded on the 1st; 705 Guillemots flew past the Hoe on the 6th. A Red Breasted Merganser flew West on the same day. 350 Gannets were seen offshore plus 6 Great Skuas on the 8th also 44 Red Throated Divers flew past; the following day an estimated 850 Guillemots were seen feeding just off the Hoe and 9 Pintail flew West. On the 14th, 2,000 Cormorants were recorded offshore. A Glaucous Gull was noted off the Hoe on the 23rd and 3 Shags flew West on the 24th. Two Ravens seen on the 30th plus a Buzzard flew West on the same day. A Little Egret was recorded on four dates this month.

FEBRUARY

A Yellowhammer was recorded on the 1st a bit of a rarity for the Hoe. 2,400 Cormorants flew West on the 3rd. A Drake Eider was noted offshore on the 5th plus 350 Gannets, 275 Guillemots recorded on the 6th plus 6 Med Gulls. 2 Ravens were noted carrying nest material on the 7th. A Red Kite flew over the Hoe on the 15th and on the same day 10 Stonechats were recorded. A Rook flew West on the 18th and 3 Peregrines were logged. 3 Snipe observed on the 28th.

MARCH

The month started off with a Hoe rarity on the 1st by way of a Woodcock followed the next day with 23 Bar Tailed Godwits moving East plus a Little Gull. 230 Red Throated Divers flew East on the 4th, a Black Throated Diver was noted on the 6th. The first Firecrest of the spring turned up on the 11th and on the same day 670 Brent Geese flew East. Sandwich Terns were noted on the 12th, 4 Avocets flew East on the 14th. 3 Black Redstarts were recorded on the 21st. 10 Black Tailed Godwits seen flying East on the 24th. 9 Siskin flew East on the 26th and a Collared Dove was noted on the same day. The first Chiffchaffs off the year were noted on the 29th then 2 Wheatear on the 30th, also on the 30th 575 Common Scoter flew up channel and 32 Shoveler moved East.

APRIL

A Short Eared Owl was observed close to the security compound on the 1st. The first Common Sandpiper of the year was noted on the 5th also a Sparrowhawk was logged that day. 2 Black Throated Divers were seen on the 6th, 10 Whimbrel flew East on the 12th. The first Ring Ouzel of the year was recorded on the 14th. A female House Sparrow noted on the 15th also 5 Black Necked Grebes were seen offshore drifting East. Also a Great Northern Diver and 2 Long Tailed Duck followed by 300 Common Scoter. On the 16th a Long Eared Owl was logged on the Hoe. 4 Little Gulls flew East on the 18th. The first Common Whitethroat of the year was recorded on the 19th followed by a Lesser Whitethroat on the 20th. A Red Kite flew over on the 21st.

MAY

Passage of Seabirds and Waders was prominent this month with 70 Common Scoters moving East on the 2nd, 360 Sandwich Terns flew East on the 6th, 150 Bar Tailed Godwits moved up channel on the 8th, 41 Whimbrel flew past the Hoe also on the 8th. 2 Swifts in off the sea on the 9th and 6 Red Kites flew West over the Hoe. On the 11th 7 Manx Shearwaters flew East along with 18 Little Terns and 2 Black Throated Divers also recorded on that day were 527 *Commic Terns* moving East. 18 Red Breasted Mergansers flew East on the 12th also 6 Pomarine Skuas flew past on the 11th, 2 adult Black Redstarts seen feeding young on the 14th. 8 Sanderling on the 22nd, 3 Common Sandpipers on the 24th and 29 Ringed Plovers on the 25 th. A Hobby and 4 Buzzards were recorded on the 3rd also logged that day were a Reed Warbler, Ring Ouzel and a Collared Dove plus 85 Swallows were seen to come in off the sea.

JUNE

One Common Sandpiper noted on the 3^{rd} and a Red Kite was logged on the 5^{th} . 2 Peregrine chicks recorded on the 10^{th} and a Honey Buzzard was seen flying in an Easterly direction. 7 Barnacle Geese moving East on the 11^{th} . 100+ Swifts noted on the 18^{th} , also a Coal Tit. 10 Stonechats were present on the Hoe on the 26^{th} plus 6 Ravens were logged.

JULY

Two fledged young Peregrines were noted on the 3rd, 1 Curlew flew East and a Red Kite flew over the Hoe on the 8th, a Shag was recorded offshore on the 9th. On the 10th a Hoe rarity by way of a Mistle Thrush was noted. A Rock Pipit and two young recorded on the 11th. 7 Common Scoter flew East on the 13th and a Honey Buzzard on the 14th. 12 Stonechats logged on the 15th. A Garden Warbler seen on the 16th and 5 Ravens on the 18th. 2 Blackcaps on the 23rd and 3 Common Sandpipers on the 24th plus a Willow Warbler. Two Buzzards flew over on the 25th. 2 Sedge Warblers recorded on the Hoe on the 27th. First of the returning Wheatears noted on the 28th along with 2 Reed Warblers. 5 Black Redstarts logged on the 28th.

AUGUST

Thirty four Swifts flew West on the 2nd and 3 juvenile Black Redstarts were also seen. A flock of 300 Starlings were recorded on the Hoe. 2 Lesser Black Backed Gulls with 2 young were noted on the security compound roof on the 3rd. A Hobby observed on the 6th. 35 Sand Martins flew over on the 9th, 7 Common Sandpipers recorded on the 12th. 14 Stonechats logged on the 16th. 2 returning Common Redstarts noted on the 19th, 30 Common Gulls flew West on the 21st and an Osprey was also seen flying West on the 23rd. First of the returning Whinchats were seen on the 24th and 6 Wheatears on the 27th. A Spotted Flycatcher was observed on the 30th.

SEPTEMBER

A Hen Harrier flew out to sea on the 2nd, 5 Whinchats along with the first Pied Flycatcher were recorded on the 6th. 5 Wheatears logged on the 13th and a Short Eared Owl was recorded coming in off the sea, 1,000 House Martins recorded on the 15th. 13 Kestrels were observed along the cliff tops on the 16th and a lone Firecrest was noted on the Hoe. Good numbers of Rock Pipits were recorded on the west beach on the 20th. A Spotted Flycatcher was recorded on the 27th along with a Great Spotted Woodpecker and a Kingfisher.

OCTOBER

The first Ring Ouzel of the autumn recorded on the 8th along with 2 Bramblings and a Yellow Browed Warbler. 20 Med Gulls noted on the 11th and a Tree Sparrow flew over the Hoe. The second Kingfisher of the year was logged on the 14th. Small movement of Goldcrests noted on the 20th. On the 28th a Merlin was observed coming in off the sea, 246 Brents flew East, 2 Red Throated Divers off the Hoe and a Grey Phalarope sighting was a probable, a Woodcock was observed on the Hoe also on the 8th.

NOVEMBER

A Firecrest and a Purple sandpiper were recorded on the 5th, 2 Greenfinches, a Samphire Hoe rarity, were noted on the 8th. 4 Little Egrets flew past on the 10th, a male the last Ring Ouzel of the year was recorded on the 15th, 4 Ravens were logged on the same day plus a Short Eared Owl. 10 Curlew flew East on the 19th and 144 Gannets were seen out at sea plus 2 Eiders seen flying East. Four Little Gulls flew past the Hoe on the 23rd.

DECEMBER

Two Black Redstarts and 4 Ravens recorded on the 6th also 4 Redwings noted. 30 Med Gulls seen on the west beach the 8th. A Short Eared Owl was seen hunting over the Hoe on the 10th, 3 Song Thrushes on the same date. 10 Red Throated Divers recorded on the 10th, 35 Kittiwakes on the 11th plus a Shag offshore.

The highest counts made in January were 56 on the 6th then 20 on the 7th. The only count made during February was of 5 on the 3rd. Spring passage was noted in March with easterly movements recorded with 228 on the 3rd, 670 on the 11th, 281 on the 14th, 580 on the 24th and 725 noted on the 30th. At the beginning of April, 440 were logged moving East and at the latter part of the month 55 flew up channel, 5 recorded on the 30th were the last records for the spring.

Two on the 6th and 9th of January. 1 flew East on the 27th of February. 7 moved East on the 17th of March and 18 on the 24th. 8 flew East on the 2nd of April and 2 on the 29th. 4 on the 6th of May then 3 on the 19th. 6 flew East on the 6th of June. Not recorded again until a single was noted on the 30th of September. 25 flew past on the 28th of October and 9 on the 30th. The only other record was of 1 on the 16th and 18th of November.

Nine flew past on the 9th of January, 6 up Channel on the 23rd of February, 10 flew East on the 26th and 20 on the 27th. 5 went East on the 24th of March. 2 past the Hoe on the 28th of October.

TEAL

Seven flew past on the 17th of March then 3 on the 30th. The next record was of 1 on the 23rd of August. One remained on the main pond throughout the first week in September, 5 seen on the west pond on the 6th of September, 3 on the 13th then 1 on the 25th and 27th. One on five dates in October, 2 on the 10th and 11th. 2 on the 6th of November.

EIDER

One Drake off the Hoe on the 5th of February. 2 flew East on the 19th of November.

COMMON SCOTER

Melanitta nigra

Mainly a passage bird

Only two records during the first two months of the year both of which were in February 13 on the 3rd and 3 East on the 4th. Easterly passage was recorded in March with peak counts of 575 on the 30th and 140 on the 31st. Spring passage continued in April with counts of 640 on the 2nd, 355 on the 6th, 300 on the 15th, 99 on the 28th and 154 on the 29th. 245 moved East on the 8th of May, 20 on the 11th and 8 on the 22nd. 7 birds noted flying up Channel on the 13th of July. 21 flew West on the 21st of August and 68 on the 31st. During the last three months of the year numbers were scarce with only 4 seen on the 28th of October and 3 on the 29th.

LONG TAILED DUCK

Clangula hyemalis Scarce Passage bird Two flew East on the 15th of April.

GOOSANDER

Mergus merganser Scarce Passage bird Two flew West on the 29th of November.

RED BREASTED MERGANSER

One flew past the Hoe on the 6th and 7th of January. 1 went East on the 15th of February. 1 flew East on the 3rd of March and 3 on the 11th. Two noted on the 2nd and 6th of April. 1 flew East on the 8th of May and 3 on the 12th.

PHEASANT

Occasional visitor

One on the 14th and 15th of March. 1 on the 30 of September. Two on the 16th and 25th of October. Ten birds recorded on the 12th and 21st of November and again with 2 on the 13th of December and on the 26th.

RED THROATED DIVER

Garvia stellate

Winter visitor

The first recorded birds of the year were 27 flying past the Hoe on the 1st of January then 31 on the 4th, 44 on the 9th and 43 on the 14th. 22 were observed on the 3rd and 15th of February flying West then 122 were seen flying past the Hoe on the 28th. Numbers of birds moving mainly East past the Hoe increased in March with 170 on the 3rd, 250 on the 4th, 90 flew West on the 5th. 57 moved East on the 6th then 90 on the 26th. Highest count for April was 5 on the 17th. Last birds of the spring were 2 seen flying East on the 8th of May. First birds of the winter were 2 off the Hoe on the 28th of October. 3 off the Hoe on the 19th and 22nd of November, 4 flew East on the 24th. Counts made in December were singles on the 4th and 6th, and 2 on the 11th and 13th.

BLACK THROATED DIVER

Garvia arctica

Winter visitor

One off the Hoe on the 16th of March then again on the 6th and 9th of April, the last spring sighting was of 2 on the 11th of May.

GREAT NORTHERN DIVER

Garvia immer

Scarce winter visitor

One recorded off the Hoe on the 15th of April, the only other record was of 1 on the 6th of December.

FULMAR

Fulmarus glacialis

65 flew East on the 6th January, 29 on the 8th, 4-6 noted of Samphire Hoe on several dates in February. 40 flew East on the 2nd of March, a Blue Morph phase was reported on the 25th of March. 14 offshore on the 15th of April. Highest days total in May was of 8 on the 15th, 2-6 on ten other dates. Single sighting only on four dates in June and 1 in July. 6 recorded on the 23rd of August and 4 on the 30th. 4 on the 6th of September were the last birds of the summer. First of the returning birds were 6 recorded on the 29th of November. Two on the 10th and 12th of December and 3 on the 6th and 12th. *Pair held a territory but no proof of breeding obtained.*

MANX SHEARWATER

Puffinus puffinus Passage bird

One flew East on the 21st of April. 1 East on the 5th of May, 2 East on the 7th, 4 on the 8th, 6 on the 9th, 7 on the 11th, 5 on the 15th and 1 on the 22nd.

LITTLE GREBE

One on the main pond on the 17th, 19th and 23rd of April, 1 on the 8th of May and on five other dates but not recorded again after the 17th.

There was no attempt at breeding this year and we believe this was due to lack of cover and very low water levels.

GREAT CRESTED GREBE

Mainly a winter visitor

Nine offshore on the 7th of January, 12 on the 8th. 46 flew West on the 15th of February, 2 offshore on the 23rd. 155 flew East on the 2nd of March, 67 on the 3rd and 38 on the 20th. Three offshore on the 1st of April 4 on the 3rd and 29th. First bird of the winter was recorded on the 19th and 22nd of November.

SLAVONIAN GREBE

Three offshore on the 12th of April.

BLACK NECKED GREBE

Scarce Passage bird
Five drifted East on the 15th of April.

GREY HERON

Ardea cinerea Passage bird

Between January and July there were eighteen single sightings of this species flying past the Hoe, most of the records came from January and February but the other five months all recorded at least one or two birds. Two seen flying past the Hoe on the 5th of August and singles on four other dates, September records were much the same as August. 1-2 records throughout October. One on the 12th of November and 2 flew East on December the 11th and one West on the 31st.

LITTLE EGRET

Egretta garzetta Passage bird

One recorded on four dates in January and three dates in February. One flew West on the 7th of March. Single on the rocks at the east end on the 16th of April. Not recorded again until one was observed flying past the Hoe on the 20th of August. One recorded on six dates in September and 2 were logged flying West on the 11th and 17th. 1-3 recorded on ten dates in October and 7 flew past on the 14th. During November one was seen on the 5th and 12th, 2 on the 6th and 27th and 4 on the 10th. Single sightings on six dates in December and 4 noted on the 10th.

GANNET

Morus bassanus

Winter visitor/Passage bird

Good numbers recorded offshore during January with 90 observed offshore on the 1st, 100 on the 6th and 7th and 300 on the 8th. Numbers remained high in February, 350 noted offshore on the 3rd and 350 on the 5th. As in January, numbers dropped to double figures on several dates in February. Birds were recorded moving East throughout March with counts of 120 on the 2nd and 50 on the 3rd and 30th. 190 flew East on the 2nd of April, 54 on the 12th and 55 on the 21st, 100 flew West on the 29th. 32 were recorded offshore on the 5th of May and a further c100 on the 11th. 2 flew East on the 11th of June and 5 on the 12th, 5 on the 29th of August and 11 on the 31st. First birds of the autumn were a single on the 14th of October and 5 on the 28th. 144 offshore on the 19th of November. Highest counts in December were 10 on the 9th and 30th and 15 on the 31st.

SHAG

Mainly a winter visitor

Two on the 6^{th} of January, 1 on the 7^{th} then 6 on the 9^{th} , last sighting for the month being 3 flying West on the 24^{th} . One on the 21^{st} and 28^{th} of February and then on the 2^{nd} , 20^{th} and 29^{th} of March. One recorded on the 18^{th} , 19^{th} and 22^{nd} of May. One offshore on the 9^{th} of July. During August one was recorded on the 21^{st} of August and 3 on the 31^{st} . Two on the 6^{th} of September and 1 on the 11^{th} , 17^{th} and 18^{th} . 2 on the 16^{th} of December.

One on the 29th of March and 15th of April. Not recorded again until August when 1 was noted on the 23rd, 27th and 30th. Pair recorded on the Hoe on the 6th of September and a single sighting on September the 26th. One juvenile logged on the 3rd of October and singles on the 13th and 18th. One recorded on the 12th of November.

One flew out to sea on the 2nd of September.

One flew over the Hoe on the 15^{th} of February, 2 went West on the 19^{th} of April and then 1 on the 21^{st} . Six flew West over the Hoe on the 9^{th} of May and 1 flew North. One on the 5^{th} of June and the 8^{th} of July.

One flew West on the 30th of January, Single sightings on two dates in April plus 4 on the 18th. 4 possible migrants on the 3rd of May. Two over the Hoe on the 25th of July. One flew East on the 1st of September, and one on the 27th and 30th. 1 on the 21st of November.

Two flew East on the 5th of May, 1 on the 23rd and 29 on the 25th. 1 flew over the Hoe on the 23rd of August. 6 went East on the 28th of October.

WHIMBREL

First of the spring passage was recorded from the Hoe on the 12th of April when 10 birds were seen flying up channel, 3 on the 21st and 22nd, 8 on the 27th and 11 on the 29th. Good numbers moving up Channel during May with 26th on the 5th, 47 on the 6th, 57 on the7th and 20 on the 10th. Smaller numbers were recorded moving East on several other dates. Returning birds were recorded on the 8th and 24th of August with 1 on these two dates.

CURLEW

One flew West on the 30th of January. One East on the 3rd of March, 1 West on the 7th, 3 on the 24th. One on the 3rd of July and on the 4th of October. 10 flew past the Hoe on the 19th of November.

One on the 17^{th} of January. One on the 7^{th} then 3 on the 28^{th} . Three recorded on the 1^{st} of March singles on the 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} and 24^{th} . Last bird of the spring was one on the 12^{th} of April. The only other record for the year was of 1 on the 16^{th} and 19^{th} of November.

GREY PHALAROPE

One possible sighting on the 28th of October.

COMMON SANDPIPER

First bird of the year was recorded on the 5th of April the next record was of 3 on the 24th of May then a single on the 25th. 1 on the 3rd of June. 3 noted on the 24th of July, 7 on the 12th of August and 1 on the 28th. 2 logged on the 2nd of September. Last bird of the year was 1 on the 30th of October.

KITTIWAKE

Risa tridactyla Passaae bird

Twenty six flew past the Hoe on the 1st of January, 304 on the 7th and 108 on the 14th. 100 flew past on the 5th, 112 on the 6th, 60 on the 22nd, 100 on the 23rd and 80 on the 24th. 10 noted offshore on the 3rd of March and 5 on the 25th. 32 flew East on the 27th of April. 5 recorded on the 6th of May and 12 on the 19th. 2 noted on the 31st of August. A count of 60 were noted flying past on the 22nd of November, 2 on the 28th. In December, counts of 40 on the 6th, 38 on the 11th and 30 on the 13th.
